## **Dates to Keep in Mind**

October 16: Deadline for online voter registration and registration by mail

October 22: Early in-person voting begins at your municipal clerk's office.

October 31: Deadline to request an absentee ballot.

November 5: ELECTION DAY! Polls open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. If you are in line by 8 p.m., you must be allowed to vote.

**Concerning that October 31 date above,** if voter turnout for the August primary is any indication, the November election will have record turnout, so please be kind to your municipal clerk and <u>do not wait until the last minute to request your absentee ballot</u>. For those with a request already on file, absentee ballots will be mailed no later than September 19.
