Dates to Keep in Mind

October 16: Deadline for online voter registration and registration by mail

October 22: Early in-person voting begins at your municipal clerk's office.

October 31: Deadline to request an absentee ballot.

November 5: ELECTION DAY! Polls open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. If you are in line by 8 p.m., you must be allowed to vote.

Concerning that October 31 date above, if voter turnout for the August primary is any indication, the November election will have record turnout, so please be kind to your municipal clerk and do not wait until the last minute to request your absentee ballot. For those with a request already on file, absentee ballots will be mailed no later than September 19.
