Backpack Full of Cash is a 90-minute documentary about the real and ongoing movement to privatize public education and its effects on traditional public schools and the students they enroll. With actor and activist Matt Damon narrating, "Backpack" tells a scary but important story about corporate school reform policies that critics say are aimed at destroying the U.S. public education system, the country's most important civic institution.
