BE A RESPONSIBLE ELECTRONICS RECYCLER

Electronics or E-cycling has to meet certain requirements. Most items (T.V.,

DVD/VCR, fax machine, keyboards, mice, speakers, flash drive, hard drives, and cell phone) are banned from landfills. This is due to the fact that some electronics have toxic and/or chemicals that can poison the landfills. Also some electronics have valuable metals such as gold, silver, copper, lead and nickel that can be harvested.

Expect to pay a small cost for the special handling of these items.

Be a responsible recycler. Make sure your data is wiped out; ask if they do it. Be sure that the e-waste will be handled by companies that will keep it in the US and not send it overseas to pollute another country. China used to be a partner in recycling but stopped accepting recycling on January 1, 2018.

Places to recycle in Green Bay –call ahead to confirm hours and costs.

Brown County Recycling, 2561 S Broadway, Ashwaubenon, 920-492-4950, cost 30 cents/pound, hours –Thursday 12-6 and Saturday 8 – 2, They will recycle any electronics.

Cyber Green, 844 Willard Drive Ste 5, Green Bay 54304, 920-246-7143, example cost is \$20 for TV 25”to 29” screens <cybergreenllc.com> They say they will recycle anything with a plug.
