<u>LWVMA Town Hall: Student Civics Education Projects</u>

2024 marks the third year of the League's support, at the state and local level, for the required student-led civics projects in Grade 8 and high school. Several MA Leagues have made progress in developing a working relationship with their local schools to support these projects. Others have encountered obstacles. LWVMA would like to see this project grow to include more Leagues and the LWVHW Steering Committee has this topic on our radar/wish list. **We need YOUR help to create a proposed framework for how we can partner with HW schools** and the state League is providing a support network to assist us. If this interests you, this Town Hall Zoom may be a good first step!

Six local Leagues will discuss their experience and answer questions about how other Leagues can begin a partnership with their local schools to support the student civics projects and
