

Nomination papers must be returned to the Wenham Town Clerk's office no later than 5:00 pm on Thursday, February 22, 2024. To get your name on the ballot, nomination papers must be certified with at least 21 signatures of Wenham voters (40 for School Committee). It is suggested you obtain at least 10:20 additional signatures in case a few are not able to be certified by the Town Clerk's office. In January, Massachusetts sent out Vote by Mail postcards to every registered voter. If you are using this card, please make sure yours is signed, dated, and you've checked off which elections and party ballot (if unenrolled). In order to vote by mail in the March 5th primary, these are due back to the respective Town Clerk's offices by February 27 at 5PM.


You can also request a Mail-In Ballot from the Secretary of the Commonwealth.
