

The Candle Signal – Light for Our Democracy



Keeping a candle or lantern lit in a window is a quiet symbol of **solidarity and resistance**. It echoes the "one if by land, two if by sea" lanterns from an early troubled time.

Many of us have battery operated holiday candles perfect for this small action. If you don't, ask at the next standout and you may find a loaner.

This action is not affiliated with the League specifically, though the first nationwide League event of this crisis (held in March) was <u>Light for Our Democracy</u>, so it fits a theme!

LWVUS Launches New Engagement Initiative



Unite and Rise 8.5!

The League defines a Constitutional Crisis as: "When the executive, the legislative, or judiciary branches cannot or will not adequately protect the US Constitution, when there are explicit attempts to dismantle a functional democracy within any of the three branches, or when any level of federal government takes action to destroy democratic institutions in a manner that intentionally or purposefully jeopardizes the US Constitution." When these events occur, the constitution is deemed at the highest serious risk and warrants full-scale action to preserve and protect democratic institutions and civil society. Through Unite and Rise 8.5, the League will engage and mobilize 8.5 million voters to protect and preserve our democracy. Year 105: Democracy Forward!

For 105 years, Leaguers have gathered around the Commonwealth to organize and mobilize voters at the polls and the State House. From the 19th Amendment to the VOTES Act of 2022, the League of Women Voters has been at the forefront of empowering voters and defending democracy.

Convention is being held on Saturday, June 14, from 9 AM to 4 PM in person at <u>EnVision Hotel</u> <u>Mansfield/Foxboro</u> (31 Hampshire Street, Mansfield). The schedule includes:

- Light breakfast
- Lunch
- Motivational Group Activity
- Interactive break-out sessions on important topics
- Program Planning and Budget for the next biennium
- Vote on Reparations Study Consensus
- Election of LWVMA Officers and Directors

✓ The *SAVE Act* is *Still* on the Table!

As long as the SAVE Act hasn't been voted on in the Senate, these actions are worth taking and sharing in your circles:

- <u>Tell your Senators to oppose the SAVE Act</u>: the Senate must reject this bill to prevent it from becoming law. <u>Call</u> the US Capitol switchboard at 202-224-3121 (*pro tip: save this in your contacts!*) or <u>take email action</u>.
- Take a moment to <u>respond to your member of the House's vote</u> on the SAVE Act either by <u>calling</u> the switchboard (aren't you glad you saved it in your contacts?) or <u>take email action</u>.
- **Get familiar** with these great <u>Talking Points compiled by LWVUS</u> to help push back on misinformation.
- Share information with young voters: LWVUS CEO, Celina Stewart, wrote an excellent and
 informative op-ed for Teen Vogue about the harm the SAVE Act will cause nationwide: What is
 the SAVE Act? The Trump Admin's Attempt to Strip Voting Rights from Women and Young
 People.
