


Stand Out for DEMOCRACY! 👹 (Bring the SUN! 🥮)



LWVMA Action Alert: DEFEND DUE PROCESS

Last week brought news of yet another family being terrorized by Immigration and Customs

<u>Enforcement (ICE)</u>. ICE is arresting and detaining people without warrants. Immigration infractions are civil, **not** criminal. Anyone charged with a crime in Massachusetts is already held accountable through our criminal justice system. While we understand the state constraints around reining in a federal agency, NOW is the time to raise our voices and urge all electeds to demand enforcement of due process protections guaranteed by the U.S. Constitution. Our federal delegation has demonstrated their commitment to human rights, but we can no longer turn a blind eye to daily ICE abuses. <u>Learn how to turn your outrage into action</u>.


LWVUS Launches New Engagement Initiative



The League defines a Constitutional Crisis as: "When the executive, the legislative, or judiciary branches cannot or will not adequately protect the US Constitution, when there are explicit attempts to dismantle a functional democracy within any of the three branches, or when any level of federal government takes action to destroy democratic institutions in a manner that intentionally or purposefully jeopardizes the US Constitution."When these events occur, the constitution is deemed at the highest serious risk and warrants full-scale action to preserve and protect democratic institutions and civil society. Through Unite and Rise 8.5, the League will engage and mobilize 8.5 million voters to protect and preserve our democracy. In case you missed it, The League and the National Partnership for New Americans collaborated on a <u>guide to supporting the immigrant community</u>. The House <u>also passed the *No Rogue Rulings Act*</u>, an attack on our system of checks and balances.


✓ The SAVE Act is Still on the Table!

As long as the SAVE Act hasn't been voted on in the Senate, these actions are worth taking and sharing in your circles:

- <u>Tell your Senators to oppose the SAVE Act</u>: the Senate must reject this bill to prevent it from becoming law. <u>Call</u> the US Capitol switchboard at 202-224-3121 (*pro tip: save this in your contacts*!) or <u>take email action</u>.
- Take a moment to <u>respond to your member of the House's vote</u> on the SAVE Act either by <u>calling</u> the switchboard (*aren't you glad you saved it in your contacts*?) or <u>take email action</u>.
- **Get familiar** with these great <u>Talking Points compiled by LWVUS</u> to help push back on misinformation.
- Share information with young voters: LWVUS CEO, Celina Stewart, wrote an excellent and informative op-ed for Teen Vogue about the harm the SAVE Act will cause nationwide: <u>What is</u> <u>the SAVE Act</u>? The Trump Admin's Attempt to Strip Voting Rights from Women and Young <u>People</u>.

The center and it's staff affirm the dignity and humanity of the farmworker by advocating for the passage of:
 - An Act Establishing Fairness for Agricultural Workers <u>H.2108/S.2012</u>
 - An Act relative to overtime pay for agricultural laborers in Massachusetts H.3107/S.2011
- <u>Meet the Legislative Specialist: Gun Violence Prevention (recording)</u> (May 8) Presented by LWVMA (<u>accompanying slides</u>). Caroline Ellis, longtime activist and LWVMA Legislative Specialist for Gun Violence Prevention took a deep dive into:
 - An Act relative to firearm industry accountability and gun violence victims' access to justice <u>S.1653/H.2672</u>
 - An act to promote safe firearm storage education and increase the well-being of students <u>S.397/H.548</u>
- <u>The Future of Journalism and Democracy in the Digital Age (recording)</u> (April 29) Presented in partnership with Democracy Maine and the League of Women Voters of Alaska and Colorado.
- <u>LWVMA Town Hall: Supported/Opposed Legislation 2025-2026 (recording)</u> (April 17) Learn from chair Jen Muroff about the Legislative Action Committee and the bills LWVMA is prioritizing this session. (accompanying slides) Visit the legislative tracking page for more information. This is a FANTASTIC primer on how the League advocates for and against legislation at the state level.
