LWVUS and LWV of California issued a joint statement in response to the deploying of National Guard troops against largely peaceful protestors in Los Angeles County. <u>Read the full statement</u>.

Updated: Protest Safety Guidance

The League believes the freedom to protest and assemble is a critical function of our democracy. We will not be silenced, and now is the time to put our words into action! We also know that even a peaceful event can become disruptive or violent or be targeted by law enforcement or outsiders, and all attendees should understand the risks involved.

While the League is **not an official national partner of the <u>No Kings</u> nationwide action on June 14**, we know that many members want to exercise their First Amendment rights and participate in a No Kings rally or in other demonstrations. We want all League members to stay safe while doing so. **Accordingly, LWV staff have updated our <u>latest protest guidelines here</u>.**
