- LWVMA's virtual event "Open Town Meeting: Remote and Secure" was held Tuesday, July 8. Event recording and presentation slides are now available. Every Town Meeting season, folks across the Commonwealth governed by the Open Town Meeting format raise criticism about access to the vote when voters can't be in person due to schedule conflicts, disabilities, caregiving responsibilities, and more. State law currently requires that Open Town Meetings be conducted on an in-person only basis and this disenfranchises many voters. LWVMA is supporting a bill, H.2274 An Act authorizing remote participation at Town Meeting.
- LWVMA 2025 Convention Keynote Address Attorney General Campbell's powerful keynote
 emphasized the importance of civic engagement, equity, and justice in our democracy. It's now
