

The USCIS decision to bar nonpartisan organizations from providing voter registration services at naturalization ceremonies is an attempt to keep new citizens from accessing their full rights."   - October 22, 3:30 to 5 PM: "Building Coalitions to Amplify Action"


# **OTHER IMPORTANT REMINDERS:**
