In order to ensure the safety of staff and League members, on-site meetings at our office will no longer be hosted until further notice. All meetings will shift online through Zoom or will be hosted through the teleconference line. This includes the Annual Meeting in June, the summer internship program, and the Speakers Bureau during the fall, which will also be adapted to

Thank you to everyone who donated on #GivingTuesday and everyone who has responded to our action calls during this time of crisis. We are doing the best we can to uphold the League infrastructure and connect you to all opportunities of civic engagement. Together we make Democracy Work, and together we must keep up the fight because the year is not over—we have an important Census count still underway and a critical election up ahead.

If you have not completed the 2020 Census, please take the time now to respond by visiting my2020census.gov. It's quick and easy! The 2020 Census questionnaire will take about 10 minutes to complete. The self-respond period has now been extended to October 31, 2020. Help us spread the word and ensure an accurate count for Los Angeles. You can inspire others. Tell everyone—your friends and family, neighbors—within safe means—to respond to the Census too! Census results have an impact on planning and funding for health clinics and highways, fire departments and disaster response, education programs such as Head Start and college tuition assistance, and so much more.

As we adapt to this time period, we need to prepare for the future of our elections now. The way we participate in our democracy will have to shift. Our vote must be protected just as much as our health and safety. We are thrilled to see that California is rolling out an election plan that will address these concerns for the General Election this November. Recognizing the threat COVID-19 continues to pose to public health, Governor Gavin Newsom signed an executive order to ensure that Californians can exercise their right to vote in a safe and accessible manner. The order requires that each county's elections officials send vote-by-mail ballots to all registered voters. We hope this encourages an increased number of voters to participate, because no one should have to choose between their health and having a say in our democracy!

Details on this virtual Convention are still being worked out, but the following information has been shared:

- Business sessions will be held on June 25-27, and the agenda will be planned with consideration towards all time zones.
- A full plenary will be hosted, and working closely with the parliamentarian, all governance guidelines will be observed in the virtual space. All requirements around delegates, quorum, and how we conduct our business will remain the same. Detailed instructions will be sent to all delegates ahead of the first plenary session.
- The Convention Awards will carry on as part of this virtual experience, and <u>details can be found</u> <u>here.</u>
- All current registrants will receive a full refund. An email from our registration software will be sent soon with instructions. We are also offering registrants the option to convert their registration fee to a donation to the League of Women Voters Education Fund.
- We are working with the hotels on all existing hotel reservations. All reservations will be canceled at no penalty.


DIVERSITY, EQUITY AND INCLUSION TASK FORCE

To find out, you'll want to participate in a webinar set for Monday evening, June 15, 2020 beginning at 6:15 p.m.


The League of Women Voters US laid out a vision for how the League can seek to remain a vital organization and network that focuses on engaging new members, embracing Diversity,

Implementation of this plan will be a continuing process led by members, committees, staff, and the Board of Directors.
