The League of Women Voters is a non-partisan organization whose purpose is to promote political responsibility through informed and active participation of citizens in government and to act on selected governmental issues.

Washington State granted women the right to vote in November 1910, the fifth state in the union to do so. The 19th amendment to the U.S. Constitution, which granted all women the right to vote, was passed in 1919. The League of Women Voters of the U.S. was founded that same year.

Membership is open to all citizens of voting age.
