Voting Information

Virginia has elections every year. The Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Attorney General are elected every four years (next in 2025). Virginia's legislative body, the General Assembly, is divided into two chambers: the House of Delegates and the Senate. Delegates are elected for two-year terms and senators for four-year terms (next in 2023).

Voter registration: All citizens must be registered within Montgomery County before voting. You may register at the Office of Elections at 1546 N. Franklin Street, Christiansburg or at the Division of Motor Vehicles, 385 Arbor Drive, Christiansburg. Or you may complete the voter registration application on the Department of Elections website (elections.virginia.gov). You can also register by mail.

To register—requirements: You must be a citizen of the United States, a resident of Virginia, at least 18 years old by the time of the election, and not be a convicted felon (unless the governor has restored your voting rights). There are no fees to register to vote, and voters do not declare a party affiliation.

If you change your name or address, you must notify the Registrar to ensure that your name is placed in the proper precinct/polling book.

Voter notice: After you register, the local Registrar or the Department of Elections will send you a voter notice that identifies your polling place and your Congressional and General Assembly districts.

Ways to Vote: 2023 General Election

1. Vote early in person. Begins Sept 22 Office of Elections: 1546 N. Franklin St, Christiansburg, Sept. 22 – Nov. 4 8:30 am–5:00 pm M–F

Saturdays Oct 28 and Nov 4, 9 am –5 pm

 Vote by mail. Apply for a mail ballot at elections.virginia.gov or at the Office of Elections. Application deadline: Oct. 27 Mail your ballot in the postage-paid envelope postmarked by Nov 7. Take your ballot to the Office of

Elections by 7 pm, Nov 7, during office hours. A Drop Box is available.

Take your ballot to your polling place on Election Day.

A witness must sign your absentee ballot.

3. Vote in person on Election Day, Nov 7. 6 am–7 pm

Curbside voting is available during early voting and on Election Day for people with disabilities or health risks.
