

Census Update


Paper census questionnaires coming soon! If you have not participated in Census 2020, you will receive a paper questionnaire in mid-April in English and Spanish. We recommend that you complete the questionnaire either on paper, online, or on the telephone as soon as possible because enumerators will come knocking on your door starting mid-May.

If an enumerator does stop at your door and you are not there, the enumerator will leave a *Notice of Visit*. This notice will include an online response code to encourage you to self-respond.

To complete the census online, complete the following steps:

- 1. Go to https://my2020census.gov.
- 2. Click Start Questionnaire.
- 3. If you received your invitation with your Census ID, enter your Census ID that is pictured in the photo below.

If you did not receive your Census ID, misplaced it, threw it away, or the dog ate it, click **If you do not have a Census Id, click here** link.

The following incentives provide compelling reasons to complete the census:

- For every person who does not complete the census, California could lose up to \$10,000 in Federal funding every year for the next ten years.
- California could lose a representative in Congress due to an undercount.

Pat Fuetsch, Pat Smith, and I have been working with Tax-Aid to promote Census 2020 on Saturday mornings at the Martin Luther King Community Center in San Mateo, the Fair Oaks Community Center in Redwood City, and the East Palo Alto Y. While people are waiting to have their taxes processed, we were able to talk with a diverse group of people who were very receptive and fell into the "hard to reach" category. When Census 2020 went live online in mid-March, we were able to assist people on laptops. Then SIP (Shelter in Place) began and all that came to an early end.
