

#### A Message from the President

We end 2017 in our League with the Saturday, December 2, 2017, General Meeting at the Carlsbad Senior Center to learn about homelessness in San Diego County. A group of Leaguers has been studying this issue and the December 2nd meeting is the next step in a four-step process. In League, we decide on what to study and put together a study committee – that is step one. They do research, which is step two. Step three is the December 2nd educational meeting where the committee's findings are discussed. Step four, the grand finale, is a consensus meeting, where the committee presents its recommendations about what position the League should take on the issue that has been studied, and League members come to consensus on what that position should be. We are planning to have that meeting on Saturday, February 10, 2018. Once a position is adopted, we have the ability to take action, which is the point of the whole process. Every League position has been developed through this process and it is why League is so respected. We do our homework and then we take Action.

We begin 2018 with another very traditional and important part of the League Way. We will have a Program Planning General Meeting in February to review the League of Women Voter United States Positions. At this time we will look at the nationwide positions that have been developed over the years through hundreds of Local Leagues studying the same issue at the same time, having education and consensus meetings, and then arriving at nationally accepted positions. It is an aspect of League that we often forget, because we are wrapped up in our local issues. At the February Meeting we will also discuss our local positions. If you have an idea about a topic or area that our League needs to take action on, the first step is to tell the other members about it and propose either a study, or, as often happens, we find that there already has been a study done and we need to evaluate your idea and how to implement it, using the existing study.

One of our strongest features as a League is our thoroughly researched and thoughtfully adopted Positions. In December and February we will be involved in two aspects of this valuable tradition. In any case, I look forward to seeing you at both the December and February General Meetings.

By popular demand, the League's Facilitation Training workshop will be offered on Saturday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>, at the Carlsbad City Library from 1 to 4pm.

At a recent LWV-AAUW community presentation, *Civil, Civic Engagement: This is What Democracy Looks Like*, attendees requested more information and training on the ideas presented.

What we'll cover: In the training, presenters Martha Cox and Mary Thompson will briefly review why deliberative dialogue is a constructive response to uncivil discourse, how to identify, research, and frame issues for public deliberation, and how to facilitate a community conversation.

What we'll do: In small work groups, we'll take turns facilitating a conversation using National Issues Forum discussion materials. The interactive session will conclude with reflections on how deliberative dialogues can be used in our community.

The League's Facilitation Training was originally offered in May 2017 at the San Diego County Library in Vista. Since then, the 3-hour session has been presented in conjunction with Leagues in Cupertino, Orange County, Chico, and Los Angeles (thanks to Martha's airborne diplomacy!).

The Homelessness Study committee composed of League members from both North County and San Diego Leagues, has been hard at work since May 2017 studying reports, attending meetings and listening to invited experts speak on this subject. The committee has done an amazing job of researching this issue and will share what they have discovered, as well as ways we can help solve this terrible problem.

All the hard work and research on this subject are in preparation for our Leagues to form consensus on the issue. A new countywide position will enable us to take action and lobby on the problems of homelessness and how best to help those who find themselves homeless.

There will be many opportunities to support the LWV mission and make a difference in our community.

**Registering Voters**: After a short training session, you will be eligible to volunteer to staff LWV Voter Registrations Events. As events are scheduled, volunteers will be contacted for availability. At the event, you will encourage

folks to register and help them through the process. Garanteed to bring smiles to the faces of newly registered voters.

Candidate Forums: Making sure candidates for elected office are able to present their positions to the public in a civil setting. The League supplies a trained team consisting of a moderator, timer, question sorters, and questions runners for Candidate O&A sessions. Moderators run the forum asking candidates the questions the audience has generated. The timer makes sure everyone has a fair and equal time to respond to the questions. The question sorters organize the questions from the audience before handing them off to the moderator. The questions runners interact with the audience to collect the questions. Training is given for all positions. If you volunteer for this team please specify which roles you are interested in. Guaranteed to bring appreciative comments from the candidates and audience. Forums are typically on the weekends or on weekday nights and run about two hours in total.

**Pro and Con Presentations**: As part of this team, you will study the upcoming ballot measures and present both the pro and the con of the measure at public meetings. You will be partnered with another League member for the presentations and will have a chance to study and prepare with the whole Pro/Con team. These presentations typically are one hour long and occur during the day. Guaranteed to impress the audience with our non-biased information.


