We urge the Council to vote yes on Agenda Item 8A, the approval of a proposal for an independent investigation of possible violations of the Brown Act and confidentiality agreements, including the authorization to issue subpoenas in the name of the City under Section 614 of the City Charter in conducting the investigation.
