The Board of Directors consists of four officers and six directors who are elected by the annual meeting to staggered two-year terms. Additionally, not more than 4 directors may be appointed by the elected members of the Board. The appointed directors hold office until June 30 following the next annual meeting. <u>Proposed Budget 2022-23 – Judy Potter Treasurer</u>

This year's budget proposal was developed with the input from the LWV Solano County committee chairs. We anticipate income similar to last year's income. We have been contacted by the Crockett Community Foundation with a request that we help them with their upcoming election of board members. For this work of helping with the administration of their election we receive a grant which can vary in amount depending on the amount of work we are required to perform. This frequently brings us approximately \$1000. We also anticipate that we may secure donations from members and friends who participate in our adopt-a-poll program. We believe our donations, fundraising and grant income will be higher than last year, but we have proposed a slightly reduced income from dues.

We have budgeted expenses for most areas at rates very similar or identical to last year's budget proposals. Programs, Voter Services, Membership and Fundraising have all received budget allocations that are the same or very close to the same as last years. We have added a new budget area, Youth Outreach, and have allocated \$300 for expenses for this year. We are very excited about this program.

We have increased several items in the administrative budget, most are small, but we have added to our miscellaneous category to cover our zoom and google charges and to provide some extra resources for communications. We have added the extra budgeted item of \$1150 for rent on our storage locker. We have also included an item "fees to convert to 501 (c)(3) which is a one-time expense of \$600. This budget leaves us with reserves of \$1530.

Our Education Fund received donations of \$1070 this year. We had a carryover of \$138, paid half of our LWVUS PMPs \$896 and are left with a current balance of \$312. If our 501(c)(3) conversion is successful, our LWV local league Education Fund administered by the LWV CA will be closed and the balance will be forwarded to us

Voter Services Committee

Responsibilities of the committee:

The Voter Services Committee's main responsibilities are to register citizens to vote, to help people understand their rights as a citizen, to encourage eligible students in high school and college to register and to be present in the community at events and activities where people gather to promote the work of the League in Solano County. The committee is also focused on developing partnerships with other organizations who share a common passion for registering and informing citizens of their opportunities and rights as citizens.

Highlights from the year:

Serving as a Redistricting Resource—in the Fall and Winter Maryanne Perlmutter was the champion of this effort. She helped our League members understand the processes of redistricting and invited Helen Hutchinson to provide a training to educate interested members in the process. A special program was offered to members in December to view the progress of Solano County's redistricting activities by reviewing maps and comments from various "communities of interest" throughout the county. Maryanne also wrote a final report of our efforts which was forwarded to the California League Redistricting committee.

High School Voter Registration Promotion—Barbara King and Carole Paterson created letters of invitation to principals and Civics Ed. Department Chairs encouraging their use of our video Be a Decider. This video, produced by Craig Paterson and based on the Power Point materials used by the committee when inclassroom visits were possible, has been very well received by teachers using it. All school districts have been invited to participate, with a thumb drive being delivered to the school sites who request the video.

Voter Services National Grant—Thanks to the writing skills of Rami Muth, we were awarded a \$1000.00 grant from the League of Women Voters US. This grant is allowing us the opportunity to provide thumb drives to teachers, purchase VOTE lawn signs and bumper stickers. We anticipate using the funds to purchase Map the Vote postcards and stamps for use prior to the General Election.

Text Message Campaign to Youth Voters—Prior to the Primary Election in June as well as the General Election this Fall, students who have requested a reminder to vote will receive a text message from the committee.

Fairfield Adult School Citizenship Class—The Voter Services committee recognized the hard work of adults seeking their citizenship. Seventeen students received a framed certificate congratulating them on their achievement and wished them well as they prepare to take the citizenship test this year.

Responsibilities/Goals:

League's Call to Action: increase youth membership.

LWSC's Action Response: entered a partnership with Solano Youth Coalition (SYC) to provide SYC participating students civic learning opportunities by engaging them in hands-on, project-based learning activities to address that lack of civics education that exists in public education.

Note: SYC is an entity of Solano County Office of Education created to encourage a new generation of civic-minded citizens to collaborate and advocate for safe and healthy choices that impact them and their communities. Participants awarded LWVSC membership per partnership agreement.

Training of three hallmark league activities and programs were offered to SYC students:

- 1) Observer Corps Training
- 2) How to Plan and Conduct a Forum
- 3) How to register voters. (Scheduled for May 4 with John Gardner)

These activities are designed to provide students a better understanding of how government systems work; to get students involved in community issues; and to provide tools and resources on how to participate in the process of debating, electing, governing and consensus building.

Hands-on Project-based Learning Activities:

- 1) To complete Observer Corps training activity, the students are preparing to Observe a Board of Supervisors meeting during summer break in that regular meetings of that Board are held during school hours at 9 a.m. on Mondays.
- The students are preparing to conduct a State of Education in Solano County Forum, currently scheduled for April 24. They've invited school superintends and school board personnel from every city in Solano County to participate. They've received acceptances from Vacaville School Board, Fairfield-Suisun School Board, Dixon School Board, and the Solano Community College Governing Board.

LWVSC Youth Outreach Upcoming Projects:

- Invited by Solano County School Board Superintendent to provide civics learning, hands on activities for the county's alternative schools, Golden Hills and Evergreen. Have had initial meeting with the schools' Director and working on proposal for summer activity implementation.
- Working on partnering with NAACP to create and Civics Summer Camp to engage its youth members.

In addition to responding the League's direct call to action, the LWVSC's Youth Outreach goals are to: 1) use League programs, activities, and resources to prepare students to enter adulthood and society as responsible citizens respectful of humanity and individual dignity with a community mindset; and 2) to encourage ongoing engagement/membership with league and its resources used to forever protect our fragile democracy.

Highlights from the year:

- August 2021: Zoom event focusing on our 'climate change' program priority, featuring Dr. Bonnie Hamilton. A YouTube video was created and published to extend the reach of this event.
- December 2021: Zoom event focusing on our 'voter education' program priority. Coordinating with
 the efforts of Voter Services Committee, Maryanne Perlmutter shared an update on the
 redistricting efforts that affect Solano County. A video was shared that explained the work and
 deadlines of the state redistricting commission. A variety of maps were available to understand
 existing and proposed district boundaries.
- January 2022: Zoom event focusing on our 'diversity, equity, and inclusion' program priority. Dr.
 Maliika Chambers shared her work as Equity & Inclusion Manager for the City of Benicia. Adena
 Ishii shared her work as a DEI leader for LWV California. A YouTube video was created and
 published to extend the reach of this event.
- January 2022: The 'Be a Decider' video was published on our YouTube channel as a resource to encourage voter registration and active voter participation as a project of PP&E. The video is being used by the Voter Services Committee in their work with local civics educators.
- February 2022: Zoom event with two focal issues that are important to our local league... the Great Decisions study group and the pending decision on our local league tax status. Judy Potter and Jerry Hayes shared an overview of the annual Great Decisions study group. Tom Carson shared detailed information about the pending decision to change to a 501(c)(3) IRS status from our current 501(c)(4) status. Separate YouTube videos were created and published for each focal issue in this event.
- February-March 2022: 'The Sum of Us' by Heather McGhee was the focus of a 5-week book conversation with afternoon and evening sessions each week. This program focused on our 'diversity, equity, and inclusion' program priority. A total of 22 participants joined the conversations including league and community members.
- April 2022: Zoom event focusing on our 'voter education' program priority, featuring John Gardner,
 Assistant Registrar of Voters in Solano County. Mr. Gardner shared details of our specific election
 policies and procedures in Solano County with special attention to election integrity in mind. A
 YouTube video was created to extend the reach of this event.
