
Great Decisions

Hello Leaguers and Friends,



Team Member Activities Updates



Marilee Scholl our Solano Community College liaison is working on a questionnaire for SCC student LWV members, asking about gigs with LWV that could fit their needs. Free membership by itself means little in terms of real political involvement and shaping future political activism. A lot of the work that we thought they could do isn't suited to the realities of community college life. For example, helping out with voter registration in high schools sounded great, but requires detailed scheduling that's not easily

managed! Marilee has heard some suggestions, but *meaningful* work that fits their schedules is what we need and she is creating a laundry list of activities we can use to engage students and others. Contests, online events, forums, etc. are in the mix.

<u>Margo and Alice</u> are working with Delta Sigma Theta Sorority to expand our working relationship with this dynamic and well-established organization. They have already co-sponsored a forum with LWVSC, helped us register Vallejo high school students, and are very interested in leveraging their existing youth programs to support our new high school civics competition.

Community Church Connections. Margo is networking with Common Ground a group of Catholic churches, the Homeless Alliance, and Benicia Liberty Church pastors to provide LWV information online and in person.

On Hold for Covid-19. Several planned outreach activities such as to Vacaville Eventide Rotary, Napa LWV on hold, and Rio Vista Democratic Club are on hold due to Covid-19.



Member Renewals. Knowing that keeping members in good standing is as important as outreach to new members, we will contact members quarterly as their membership expires to remind them to renew. This is an ongoing effort.

VOTER SERVICES COMMITTEE

Primary Election Day, March 3, 2020

During this year's Presidential Primary the League sponsored an Adopt-a-Poll at Club Pacifica in Benicia and had over a dozen other members working at different polls around the county. It was a very interesting experience. This election was a little different, more special.

First, it was the 100th anniversary of women gaining the right vote, so expectations for women coming out to vote was high.

Second, it was a primary, which only happens every four years.

Third, the laws about registering to vote, changing parties, and changing addresses on Primary Election Day at the polls were passed just two weeks before Election Day, making training materials obsolete while they were still being used.

In addition, candidates for the Democratic Primary dropped out the day before the election, confounding a lot of voters, and finally, Covid-19 was just beginning to make itself known in Solano County.

The seventeen workers at Club Pacifica did their best to take everything in stride. We opened and closed on time; we didn't turn away any voters; clerks did incredible work to reregister folks and make sure they used the desired ballot to vote; we kept our lines short. We had hand sanitizer, wipes, and gloves provided by the county. We regrouped frequently to review the newest rules, stretch, and wash our hands. We wiped down every pen used to mark a ballot right after use.

The best part of the day was cheering first time voters, some of whom were the same young people that we had registered to vote last fall. We made democracy work, for sure!

Thanks to all of those who helped out at the polls. You did a tremendous job!

Campaign Finance Reform in Benicia

Campaign finance reform has been one of our local League's priorities since before 2018. In previous years we had City Clerks and City Attorneys speak to our group about how the current system worked and what needed to be changed in their view. The League has had a member, June Meijas, working on the Open Government Ad Hoc Committee for Campaign finance review for more than a year.

Finally, on March 3rd, a proposal for campaign finance changes came before the City Council for a vote. After much

discussion among the Council members and with the two city attorneys, the proposal was sent back to staff for more amendments and adaptations. Most of these involved how PAC's are asked to report their support of candidates, what penalties could be used if they refused, the use of persuasive polls, and negative advertising. The proposed changes would allow for Open Government to conduct more than one candidate forum per election season to address negative ads. There is no information available about when this item will appear on the City Council agenda again. Hopefully, the changes can be made before fall election filing deadlines in August.

A heartfelt "Thank You" to Gayle Vaughan. Gayle will be resigning as Chair of Voter Service effective May 21st. Gayle has found the work compelling and necessary to make democracy work, and for that reason she will continue to be a part of the Voter Service Team, just not lead it. The effort and dedication of volunteers who have been working steadily, and often behind the scenes, has been inspiring to her. Over the last six years the position of Chair has grown from one of just calling a volunteer or a teacher to set up an event in Benicia, to one of coordinating dozens of volunteers, teachers, and candidates with the help of area representatives to serve the whole county. "It's been a great learning experience, but it's time to make way for others to volunteer in leadership positions." Gayle said.

The LWVSC board and the VS leadership are working together on a committee redesign to make sure that all activities of Voter Service continues and thrives.

PROGRAM AND PLANNING COMMITTEE


