The League of Women Voters Benicia / Solano County will again co-sponsor **The Foreign Policy Association's Great Decisions program with the Benicia Public Library**. Members and the public are welcome and encouraged to participate in this discussion program which focuses on international affairs. The group uses materials prepared by the Foreign Policy Association. We view a documentary on the topic of the week, participants are encouraged to read a chapter in the Great Decisions Briefing Book that covers material related to the video presentation and then we

discuss the issues presented.

The discounted books will be distributed on a first come first serve basis to those who sign up. The books will be available sometime after the first of the year. Once the discounted books have been spoken for, books will need to be purchased individually from the Foreign Policy Association. 

VOTER SERVICES COMMITTEE

Youth Voter Registration

The Voter Service team continues to grow with new volunteers helping to register high school students and others to vote. We recently registered 5 classes of students at Mare Island Technology Academy and multiple class visitations are being scheduled for Vacaville High School and Armejo High School in Fairfield. We have several more class visits planned in January, so if you haven't been called on to volunteer it's not too late.

During our presentations some teachers have been asking us to explain the ramifications of registering Non-Party Preference (NPP), formerly referred to as "independent." It seems that many young people are resistant to joining any party. In discussions, students say they don't trust the parties because of the blind following of party policy when they don't agree with all of the party

values and that there is corruption and cronyism in both major parties. Hence, they register as NPP.

<u>During a primary election</u> that may create a problem for voters.

Ballots are given out specific to the party indicated. <u>In California, we have an open primary, except for President</u>, which means anyone can vote for any candidate regardless of party, except for President. Democrats would get a ballot showing only



Democratic candidates for President; Republicans would get one showing only Republican candidates for President; NPP voters would get a ballot with no presidential candidates.

In past primaries, some parties allow for NPP voters to receive a party ballot if requested. The parties have to file a form with the Secretary of State to indicate if they plan to allow a modified open primary which would allow NPP voters to vote using a party ballot. Traditionally the Republicans conduct a closed primary (No NPP voters), while the Democrats and Green Party conduct a modified open primary (allowing NPP voters). As of this writing, the deadline for filing the form has not yet past, so we don't yet know what the parties intend for the March primary. We should know by the beginning of November.

The young people we talked with are anxious to take part in the Presidential Primary, but are uncertain as how to register party/no party wise. We have been advising them to register their preference (in many cases NPP) and then IF the parties choose not to allow NPP to vote in their Presidential Primary, they can easily change the party by reregistering either online, or doing a same day registration at the polls on Election Day. (A recent law and new voting equipment allow same day registration votes to be counted without being considered "provisional").

This may seem like nitpicking to some, but in 2020, the 18-24 demographic will be the largest in the history of the United States. If they vote, the youth could control the elections.

We were happily surprised that the event was very well attended. We had several great conversations and gave out four voter registration forms. We all felt very good about the event... other than the heat. A BIG thank you to Becky Cecena and Jeanie White.

The Rocky Hill event led to a request for the League to staff a table at the Markham Elementary



School Fall Festival on October 4th. Margie Olson took the lead with this event and staffed a table with Ana Petero and Jim Hardwick. They had two people fill out voter registration forms on the spot and two other people took forms. One of these people had just become a citizen that very week. What a rewarding experience for them to share with this man. It is conversations like this that make what we are doing worth it.

Mock Elections. Many League members stepped up and were volunteers with the Mock Elections held by the Registrar of Voters in eight different locations throughout Solano County on October 16th. In order to work the polls that day the volunteers had to be trained in setting up and taking down the new Ballot Scanners, Touch Writers, and eRosters. Only then, could they work the polls at the Mock Elections. Other League members helped with the election by coming out to the polls and casting their votes in fun categories such as "your favorite flavor of ice cream". The point of this exercise was to identify areas where equipment training and set up needed to be enhanced. We have not received word yet on which ice cream or cartoon characters won!
