REFLECTIONS FROM OUR VICE PRESIDENT

We are living in very challenging times. Each day I read about a new mass shooting, or someone being shot for ringing the wrong doorbell or driving into the wrong driveway. My heart aches for these seemingly endless acts of violence. My great nephews are students at Covenant School in Nashville where a recent mass shooting took place. I watched that event unfold in real time as my family's text chain kept us informed about what was happening at the school. I shudder to think about what those children were forced to endure while hiding in a storage closet with their classmates and teachers. I can only imagine the horror of fleeing the building while listening to the sounds of the

AR15 around them.

This is not a philosophical conversation for me. This is real. I share this story with you because this is my WHY. This is one of many issues that guides me to this work. Today's article is a Call to Action. It is my hope that we can continually engage our membership in the powerful work of the league so that each person can identify their WHY.

While common sense gun legislation or criminal justice may not be issues that resonate with you, perhaps one of the other priorities we have identified will. The following are the key priorities that the Solano chapter of the League of Women Voters have identified for 2023-2024.

Priority #1- Racial Inclusiveness/Justice/Equity

Priority #2 - Making Democracy Work - Voter Rights/Education

Priority #3 - Climate Change with a focus on water

Priority #4 - Criminal Justice

Each of us has our own story about why we chose to spend our time and our resources in the way that we do. My **WHY** guides me to be part of this organization, the League of Women Voters, so that collectively we can help make democracy work for all people. I hope you will join us in this important work.

Susannah Delano joined Closing the Gap CA as Executive Director in January 2018. She has worked for over 15 years to promote the good health and empowerment of women and challenged communities throughout California. She is grounded in a commitment to move the needle on issues of racial justice, gender equity, and larger inclusivity.

Close the Gap California is a statewide campaign to achieve gender balance in the California Legislature by recruiting progressive women to run. The organization recruits accomplished women in targeted districts and prepares them to launch competitive campaigns. Recruits are pro-choice, pro-public school funding and support paths out of poverty.


The program will describe how Close the Gap applies strategic targeting of legislative districts. The effort starts with a detailed analysis of legislative districts to determine open or winnable seats. Close the Gap develops district profiles based on demographic information, voting data and legislative priorities. Then the search starts for progressive women leaders that best fit the district.

Great Decisions Extension (GDE), our monthly current events program, is in the planning stages. **We are soliciting input from anyone who is interested in participating** in our discussion series.

GDE is an informal discussion group made up of participants of the LWV Solano County's Great Decisions program, who wish to continue to meet and discuss current topics of interest. All are welcome. No need to have previously participated in Great Decisions.

Members of the group make suggestions about possible topics, books, articles, videos or podcasts we might wish to explore. We take a poll and select the topics that generate the most interest. Topics suggested to date include reading the book *Authoritarian Moment* by Ben Shapiro. It is a look from a very conservative view, possibly very interesting to learn about. Another suggestion is to discuss Matthew Desmond's 3/23 book, *Poverty, by America*. Desmond's 2017 book Evicted won the Pulitzer Prize for non-fiction. Desmond is a Princeton sociologist who explores why poverty remains at a higher level in the U.S. than other peer countries. There are a number of 30 – 60-minute YouTube interviews of Desmond available online to view to learn about the book.




