LWVO has begun sending Take Action notifications. The latest is about the Safeguard American Voter Elegibility (SAVE) Act. This act would require citizenship documentation to register to vote in federal elections.

Since voters already verify their citizenship when registering and it is illegal for noncitizens to register or vote, this is a waste of resources better used on election security. In addition, all Americans would have to prove their citizenship by presenting documentation in person when registering to vote or to update voter registration information. This would be the end of registering online or by mail for most voters. What's more, state drivers licenses, REAL ID, and veteran's ID would no longer be acceptable as documentation.

March 18, 7:30. Attend Hudson City Council Meeting at City Hall to observe governance in action.



Black History Month: Shirley Chisholm



Some of us remember when Shirley Chisholm ran for president and also when NOW was formed. Here's a reminder of all that she did:

Political career

- Elected to the New York State Assembly in 1964
- Elected to Congress in 1968
- Served seven terms in the House of Representatives
- Co-founded the Congressional Black Caucus (CBC) in 1971
- Co-founded the National Organization for Women (NOW) in 1970
- Served on the Education and Labor, Rules, and Veterans Affairs committees

Presidential campaign

- Ran for the Democratic presidential nomination in 1972
- Was the first African American to run for president as a major party candidate

Other accomplishments

- Supported the Equal Rights Amendment
- Fought to legalize abortions
- Helped establish the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)
- Helped raise the minimum wage for domestic workers



Advocacy Corner

Last year SB 83, the "Enact Ohio Higher Education Enhancement Act," passed in the senate but was not voted on in the house. But, now it's back as SB1 and it is moving fast!

LWVO <u>opposes</u> this bill because it's devastating to higher education, would restrict the teaching of "controversial" subjects, ban most diversity policies and programs, place entire courses and departments at risk, gut workers' rights, and much more. Please take immediate action to stop this harmful bill.




Early Bird Registration Fees (until March 12, 2025)
