Someone who <u>IS</u> doing his job is Casey Weinstein! A small contingent of LWVH members recently had dinner with State Senator Weinstein. He sits on five committees and is ranking member of two. He shared the realities of being in the statehouse right now. Casey encouraged League to continually reach out to their representatives -- meet in person, call or email. He said do them all and keep "layering it on!"

Many of us have sent emails and called. Though, in the case of Bernie

Morano and Jon Husted, reaching them has become so problematic for voters that the Columbus Dispatch created a link for voters to send comments to these senators. Try it.

I recently downloaded an easy to use tool to stay informed and contact my representatives. It's the 5 Calls app. It provides a link to descriptions of the issues and a script to use when calling your Reps.

Don't forget: NO shopping on Friday, Feb. 28 which is <u>Economic Blackout Day</u>. This boycott is targeting major retailers (Target, Amazon, Walmart, etc.) Don't buy anything--gas, fast food, on line items. It's important to remind major retailers of our collective economic power. LWVUS supports this boycott. If you must shop, buy from local businesses.

Are you looking to get more involved in League? Here are some ideas: consider joining the Board of Directors. The next board meeting is March 3, 7pm at my home. There are board positions opening up soon.

There is a LOT going on in Ohio Education right now. We could use members to join the Advocacy committee to specifically track the changes happening in Ohio and communicate the facts so we can be well informed.

Advocacy Corner

LWV Ohio's Lobby Corps is urging our Leagues to get to know our government officials on a more personal level through an informal social meeting, e.g. a coffee or dinner. So, last week we had our first "social dinner" with State Senator Casey Weinstein. We learned:

- Casey finds the Senate much different than the House. He sits next to members of the GOP and interacts with them frequently.
- Casey thought his bill regarding children's hearing aids would be a "slam dunk," but it took three attempts, an enormous amount of effort and the dedicated group of parents of children with hearing difficulties who testified before Congress.
- There will be openings on city council this year. Casey urged League members to consider running for office. He was previously on Hudson's city council and would be happy to have coffee with anyone to answer questions.

The League plans to have additional socials in the future. Possible guests include: Derrick Hall, Ohio State Rep. for OH-34, Emilia Sykes; US Rep. for OH-13; Steve DiMauro, President or Dana Addis, Superintendent of Hudson City Schools; Leslie Polott, Executive Director of Hudson Library and Historical Society.

Black History Month Frannie Lou Hamer Townsend (1917-1977)

Fannie Lou Hamer Townsend was an American voting and women's rights activist. She was the vice-chair of the Freedom Democratic Party, which she represented at the 1964 Democratic National Convention. Hamer also helped organize Mississippi's Freedom Summer and was a co-founder of the National Women's Political Caucus.

In 1962, when she tried to register to vote, she was harassed, threatened, shot at, and assaulted by racists, including the police.

She later helped and encouraged thousands of African Americans in Mississippi to become registered voters and helped hundreds of disenfranchised people through a variety of work programs.

She ran for the U.S. Senate in 1964, and the Mississippi State Senate in 1971. Hamer died in 1977, at the age of 59, in Mississippi.



US Ambassador to the United Nations, Andrew Young, delivered the eulogy at her memorial service.

She was posthumously inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame in 1993. On Jan, 4, 2025, President Joe Biden awarded her the Presidential Medal of Freedom, posthumously.


