

THE HUDSON VOTER

Hello Members!

Our Annual Member Meeting is May 15. Please review the updated LWVH <u>Nonpartisan Policy</u> and the proposed 2025-26 <u>budget</u>, which we will be voting on at the meeting. You will receive the 2024-2025 LWVH Committee Reports in the next newsletter.



Regarding the budget, at first glance it may be alarming. LWVUS has changed the way local, state and national leagues are reimbursed. Until 2025, members paid their local leagues then local leagues paid state and national their share of the dues. This is called PMP (per member payment).

As of January 2025, joining members use the portal on the website, pay with a credit card or a bank routing number (a check to our Treasurer is still acceptable also). Payment via the website is distributed directly to National, State and Local branches of LWV. Members receive an email with a receipt reflecting the amounts.

The 2024-25 Budget deficit reflects the transition of having to pay the PMP for dues collected before Jan. 1, 2025. Treasurer Connie Blohm has planned for this. LWVH has funds to cover this debt.

That stated, we are being very conservative with our 2025-26 budget so that we can see how the new system affects our income. I can report that so far it is quite seamless. The dues retained by LWVH are on track with the previous system.

Something to be aware of: In the past you were able to "round up" to pay \$100, with \$30 going into our local Donation Fund. This option is no longer available. Instead, we encourage you to donate directly to the local league, right after you've paid your dues using the LWVUS portal. This is appreciated and necessary. The board has also decided to increase our recommended dues from \$70 to \$75, which is what LWVUS recommends.

Although, now, if you wish to pay less, you can. Students are \$20.

Moving forward, we are going to have to restart our fundraising efforts to fund attendance to National Convention and various voter services materials.

In other news! Many LWVH members marched in the "Hands Off" protests. They joined thousands of people across the country protesting the government's attack on American rights and freedoms. This is true "boots on the ground", "put your money where your mouth is", "step up or shut up" action. Kudos to all of you who participated! See lots of terrific photos below!

Update on <u>HB 96</u>, Ohio Budget for FY 2026-27: The House passed it on April 9. It will now go to the senate, who are looking to pass it by June 8th. Then the bill will go to the governor around June 30th. The Senate will undoubtedly change some items. School and library funding are part of the bill and LWV Ohio has been fighting for Fair School Funding in the bill.



Divide and Rule: The Politics of Division in America

by Joseph Kisarale

Joseph Kisarale delivers a deep exploration of the forces tearing America apart. He explores the idea that democracy is supposed to serve all citizens but has instead left many unheard, neglected and disillusioned. This contributes to the rise of authoritarianism and how charismatic leaders, offering simple solutions to complex problems, appeal to those who have lost faith in the existing system.

However, these promises often come at the cost of eroding democratic norms, silencing dissent, and consolidating power. Kisarale also covers

how social media, sensationalist media coverage, and the spread of conspiracy theories have amplified distrust and deepened the cultural divides.
