ID Requirements for Ohio Voters

Make sure you have the necessary identification to successfully cast your ballot!



In-Person Voting

Early Voting at the Board of Elections or at your polling place on Election Day

One of the following unexpired documents:

- Ohio Driver's License or interim ID form or Ohio ID (issued by Ohio BMV)*
- U.S. Military or U.S. Dept. of Veterans Affairs or Ohio National Guard card
- U.S. passport or passport card



Vote by Mail

Ballot can be returned via U.S. Mail or dropped at the Board of Elections, Contact the Board of Elections for deadlines,

One of the following:

- Ohio Driver's License number or Ohio ID number (unexpired & issued by Ohio BMV)*
- Last 4 digits of social security number
- A copy of one of the documents listed to the left under "In-Person Voting"

No longer allowed: Out-of-state driver's license or ID; social security card, birth certificate; insurance card; utility bill; bank statement; government check; paycheck; other government documents; registration acknowledgment from the county board of elections.

Vote by Mail Deadlines

October 31

Vote-by-mail application must be received by Board of Elections

Board of Elections open until 8:30pm

November 6

If returned by U.S. Mail, vote-by-mail ballot must be postmarked by November 6 and received by November 13.

If returned in person to the Board of Elections, the vote-by-mail ballot must be dropped by 7:30pm on Election Day.
