Candidates will include those running for Congress, Ohio Supreme Court Justices, State Senator, State House of Representative, Appeals Court Judges, Common Pleas Court Judges, County Prosecutor, Common Pleas Court Clerk, Sheriff, Fiscal Officer, and Summit County Council. - Volunteer to distribute literature, knock on doors, write postcards, etc. You can see dates for canvassing and sign up here.




Sept. 12, 2024 LWV of Hudson meeting at the Hudson Library and Historical Society.

An Unfinished Love Story: A Personal History of the 1960's

is our next read for our Book Club. The author and her husband, Dick, were very active in politics in the 1960's, working for both John and Robert Kennedy as well as Lyndon Johnson. When examining their boxes of memorabilia, they realized they had a personal time capsule of the 1960's, a decade when individuals were powered by the conviction they could make a difference. A time, like today, marked by struggles for racial and economic justice, and when lines were drawn and loyalties tested.

Doris Kearns Goodwin is a Pulitzer Prize winning author and historian known for her biographies of many US presidents, including *Lincoln*, which we discussed last year.
