

Climate Change Workshop



Thursday, November 14 7 - 9pm Hudson High School Media Center

This roundtable is the third in a series called "Living Sustainably".

Join your neighbors to discuss questions such as:

- What should sustainable transportation systems look like to meet our community's needs 5 years from now?
- Most design goals in cities are traffic speed and safety where does reducing emissions fit in?
- What are the obstacles to efficient and sustainable transportation??
- What roles should individuals and families, the city, the county, and organizations like All-Aboard Ohio play?

In addition, you will hear information on:

- benefits and costs of electric vehicles vs. hybrids vs. gasolinepowered vehicles
- ways to increase efficiency of current modes of transportation
- ideas for reducing the environmental impact of air travel

Advocacy Corner

The General Assembly's lame duck session begins November 13. This is when bills can move quickly through the senate and house and require immediate action from citizens. Call you legislator and the bill's sponsor to make your opinion heard.

LWVO is following bills related to democracy, taxation, education, the death penalty, and guns.

Two of those bills are:

SB83 and HB 8: restricts the teaching of "controversial" subjects at colleges and universities and much more. HB8 takes away any expectation of privacy by students consulting school personnel, including school nurses and counselors. Go to the Legislative tracker URL or QR code to get more information:
