



Missed the Registration Deadline? Connecticut Lets You Vote on Election Day!

Connecticut is one of a handful of states that has Election Day Registration (EDR), which lets eligible voters register and vote on Election Day. Check your town or city's website to find out the location of the EDR polling place.

To take advantage of EDR, you must be a U.S. citizen and at least 18 years old, and will need to bring the following with you to the polls: Social Security Card, CT License or Birth Certificate as proof of identity, as well as proof of Connecticut residency (if your current address is not printed on your CT license, a piece of recent mail from a public utility or a bank statement with your name and address printed on it). And please be patient; to protect the integrity of the election, EDR does take additional time.

You will be able to vote at the same place that you register.

Make your vote count; don't forget to TURN OUT. Only 36% of eligible voters cast a ballot in the last mid-term elections (2014), the lowest turnout since 1942.
