PROPOSED MEETING RULES

- 1. QUORUM The meeting shall not begin until a quorum is present. Ten percent of the membership shall constitute a quorum.
- 2. ELIGIBILITY Every LWVO member who was current in his or her dues as of June 1, 2019, (ten days before the date of this meeting) shall be entitled to vote. Absentee and proxy voting are not permitted.
- 3. WRITTEN MOTIONS Main motions and substantive amendments shall be given to the secretary in writing, with the name of the maker of the motion included.
- 4. DEBATE TIME There shall be 2 minutes per member for debate. No one may speak on a given item until others wishing to speak have had their turns. Each speaker shall address all remarks to the Chair and shall limit such remarks to the item being considered.
- 5. PROGRAM ADOPTION
 - Each recommended program item shall be moved and seconded, but there will be no vote on any item until all items (recommended and nonrecommended) have been discussed. A majority vote is needed to adopt a recommended item.
 - Any non-recommended program item may be moved for consideration by a majority vote of members present and voting. A three-fifths vote in favor is needed to adopt a non-recommended item.
 - The vote will be taken on recommended items (with possible amendments) in the order moved, followed by the vote on non-recommended items. Amendments may be deletions from, but not additions to, program positions.
- 6. NOMINATIONS Additional nominations for Officers, Directors, and the Nominating Committee may be made from the floor, provided that the consent of the nominee shall have been secured in advance.

PROPOSED PROGRAM

Based on results of the Program Planning/Policy & Position Review meeting on January 26, 2019 and the Board Meeting on February 11, 2019, the Board recommends retaining all local LWVO and Alameda County positions.

The Program Planning/Policy & Position Review meeting and the Board also recommended the following Issues for Education and Advocacy during 2019-20:

- Government Oversight Work to correct deficiencies in City procedures to inform residents about ballot measures and provide for public discussion and debate; work with other organizations and with Councilmembers on procedures, and possibly ordinances, to provide more time and transparency in the preparation of ballot measures, including initiatives. Work to improve LWVO's own voter education and participation activities, including training LWVO members to analyze legislative proposals and ballot measures and prepare recommendations based on League positions.
- Campaign Finance Reform Follow Public Ethics Commission's work on reform of Oakland's public financing system; encourage adoption of a system similar to Seattle's voucher system, to be in place for the 2020 election. Participate in public outreach and education to build public support for new system.
- **Redistricting** Work to ensure that the City meets its administrative responsibilities and undertakes significant outreach activities to create an Independent Redistricting Commission that is competent, diverse, and committed to its mission; work with Oakland Rising and other community organizations to do outreach and community education.
- OUSD Community of Schools and Budget Issues – Monitor and analyze OUSD's development of a plan to implement its Community of Schools Policy, watching for opportunities for comment and/or advocacy using LWV's Education positions. Follow negotiations to deal with the major budget issues facing the district.
