TRAILBLAZER



Sheila Kuehl Los Angeles County Supervisor District 3

Before her service on the Board, Supervisor Kuehl served eight years in the California State Senate and six years in the California State Assembly. She was the first woman in California history to be named Speaker Pro Tempore of the Assembly, and the first openly gay or lesbian person to be elected to the California Legislature.

She served as chair of the Senate Health and Human Services Committee, Natural Resources and Water Committee, and Budget Subcommittee on Water, Energy, and Transportation, as well as the Assembly Judiciary Committee. She successfully advanced single-payer health insurance through the Legislature, twice.

Prior to serving in the Legislature, as a public-interest attorney, Supervisor Kuehl drafted and fought to get into law more than 40 pieces of legislation relating to children, families, women, and domestic violence. She was a law professor at Loyola, UCLA, and USC Schools of Law, in addition to co-founding and serving as managing attorney of the California Women's Law Center. She was also the Founding Director of the Public Policy Institute at Santa Monica College and was a Regents' Professor in Public Policy at the UCLA Luskin School of Public Affairs. Supervisor Kuehl graduated from Harvard Law School in 1978.

INNOVATION IN LEADERSHIP



Miguel Santana C.E.O. and President Weingart Foundation

Miguel has over 30 years of experience leading numerous fiscal, legislative, political, and community issues. He served as President and CEO of Fairplex since 2016, a non-profit community benefit regional organization based in Pomona, CA. Previously, Miguel was the City Administrative Officer for the City of Los Angeles, where he oversaw the City's \$9 billion budget and designed the City's first comprehensive homeless strategy, resulting in a \$1.2 billion voter-approved housing bond and a doubling of the City's general fund investment on programs to end homelessness. Prior to joining the City, Miguel served as one of five Deputy Chief Executive Officers for Los Angeles County overseeing all social service programs supporting children, families, veterans and persons experiencing homelessness.

Miguel has engaged in many civic efforts to create a more equitable Los Angeles region, including serving as Chair of the Committee for Greater LA. He has served on numerous non-profit boards including the Whittier College Board of Trustees.

Miguel A. Santana is the President and CEO of the Weingart Foundation, a private grantmaking foundation that partners with communities across Southern California to advance racial, social, and economic justice for all.

Mira Hashmall, a partner with the law firm Miller Barondess, LLP, is an experienced trial lawyer who tackles some of the most important public issues facing our society today, including homelessness, accountability of public officials, and fiscal management for public employers.

She is consistently ranked as one of the top attorneys in Los Angeles in recognition of her effective advocacy for clients and her experience handling tough cases, including matters all the way up to the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals and the U.S. Supreme Court.

Mira's commitment to the League of Women Voters is undeniable. She grew up volunteering at voter registration tables alongside her mother Katherine Gavzy, former LWV Oakland President and current LWV Pasadena Area member.

Mira is a long-time League member and she served as a board member and chair of the League's Education Fund from 2011-2015. She is also active in social, community-based organizations focused on justice and civic participation, and spearheads the women's mentoring program at her firm with a focus on empowerment and professional development.
