

As set forth by LWVUS at its 2022 National Convention, abolishing the Electoral College by US Constitutional Amendment has been elevated to one of the League's top priorities.



They witnessed "Bloody Sunday" in 1965 when state troopers on horses attacked the peaceful protesters walking across the bridge.

Their personal accounts were moving and inspirational.

Secretary of State Joslyn Benson and OU President Ora Hirsh Pescovitz paid tribute to these courageous women in their on-going fight for equality and justice for all.
