Dolores Clara Fernández Huerta is an American labor leader and civil rights activist who, with Cesar Chavez, is a co-founder of the United Farmworkers Association, which later merged with the Agricultural Workers Organizing Committee to become the United Farm Workers.

Huerta has been awarded many accolades throughout her career in activism, and in 2012 received the <u>Eleanor Roosevelt Award for</u> <u>Human Rights</u>. Perhaps most notably in the present-day Latinx community, she's known as the originator of the "Sí, se puede" chant, which means "Yes, it is possible."
