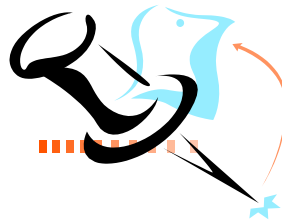

This group will be assisting with candidate forums, voter guides, a 2020 edition of *They Represent You*, voter registration and homeowner's association elections. We appreciate the volunteerism of all of our board members.

All the cities in our service area except Wayne have elections this fall. The only city that required a primary election was Livonia, with 12 council candidates running for four seats and three mayoral candidates. The League held a well-attended candidates forum on July 11th that was moderated by Susan Rowe. Assisting were Carrie Moon-Dupree, Val Nelson, Ann Abdoo, Angela Ryan, Judy Patrick, Deanna Master and Jackie Peters. We are grateful to all of them for conducting such a professional forum.

Megan Chenoweth posted the on-line voter guide on VOTE411 before the absentee ballots went out so that Livonia voters had good access to the League's non-partisan voter information.

Per the calendar on page 1, you'll see that we're planning for 3 additional forums for the cities of Westland, Northville and Belleville, which all have contested elections on November 5. Garden City and the City of Plymouth also have elections this November but they're uncontested.
