# The Citizens Not Politicians Amendment Can Fix It!

What does Citizens Not Politicians mean? It means that CITIZENS will draw the new district maps for voting, and NOT POLITICIANS. The bi-partisan group who were charged with drawing the maps a few years ago did not draw fair districts. So, now let's let non-politicians draw the maps. But, first we have to get the petition signatures so the issue can be put to the vote in the Nov. 2024 election. So, let's all get trained on how to collect signatures for this very important petition to stop gerrymandering:

- April 17, noon, zoom meeting, <u>REGISTER</u>
- April 30, 6pm, zoom meeting REGISTER
- OR, listen to this <u>recording</u>, look at these <u>slides</u>, then take this <u>quiz</u>.

#### **About the Petition:**

The LWV of Ohio is joining forces with other Leagues and Common Cause Ohio to obtain signatures on the Citizens Not Politicians Amendment. This amendment:

- Creates the 15-member Ohio Citizens Redistricting Commission made up of Democratic, Republican, and Independent citizens who broadly represent the different geographic areas and demographics of the state.
- Bans current or former politicians, political party officials, lobbyists, and large political donors from the Commission.
- Requires fair and impartial districts by making it unconstitutional to draw voting districts that discriminate against or favor any political party or individual politician.
- Requires the commission to operate under an open and independent process.


