City Council Member

Biggs is a general law city operating under the California Government Code. The City Council is the legislative body of Biggs. Each council member must serve four-year terms. It has a broad range of municipal powers including setting policy, reviewing and approving an annual budget, establishing community goals and objectives, approving the City's general plan and proposed sphere of influence, reviewing and approving major projects and hearing community problems and concerns. In addition to working together as a council, each council member has additional commissioner and committee assignments.

Number of elected officials: Five council members
Elected city wide (at large)
Located in Butte County, California.

At the 2010 census Biggs had a population of 1,707. The population density was 2,685.5 people per square mile (1,036.9/km²). The racial makeup of Biggs was 1,302 (76.3%) White, 11 (0.6%) African American, 54 (3.2%) Native American, 9 (0.5%) Asian, 1 (0.1%) Pacific Islander, 252 (14.8%) from other races, and 78 (4.6%) from two or more races. Hispanic or Latino of any race. Cycle for elections is four years (2020 – 2024).

Special qualifications:

Each council member must:

- reside within the city limits
- be a registered voter
- be 18 years or older

Term length: 4 years

Financial Compensation:

- \$300 dollars a month
- Mileage reimbursement

Regular monthly city council meetings are held on the second Tuesday of each month, starting at 6:30pm. Members of the public are invited to attend to observe and comment. City Council meetings are held in Council Chambers located at 3016 Sixth Street, Biggs, California, unless otherwise noted.
