Presidents' Message Deborah Hampton and Sandra Slayton Co-Presidents

This year, we have had the pleasure of serving as Co-Presidents, sharing the role and responsibilities inherent in the position of President. As Presidents, we not only participate in local HF Area activities, but serve as our league's conduit to LWV Cook County, LWV Illinois, and LWV U.S. The knowledge we gain from these interactions is valuable and rewarding, though it involves an enormous number of meetings and virtual contacts. Many times, over the last year, we have marveled at the resilience of our predecessor, Barbara Hayes, who served as the single President for four years and unselfishly devoted much of her time and life to the League.

We are so grateful for the assistance of our Executive Committee and Board of Directors who embrace their roles as Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, Program Chairs, Co-Chairs, and all-around supporters of the League's mission, goals, and values. Most of all, thanks to our general membership without whom, our League would not exist. You have stepped up to volunteer for various assignments, generously donated your time, talent, funds, and refreshments; supported our charitable causes and fund-raising efforts, attended many meetings, participated in numerous voter registration drives, lobbied legislative representatives on causes we've championed, and have kept our league vibrant, relevant, and serving our communities.

The League of Women Voters is a multi-level organization operating at the national, state, county, and local levels, all speaking with one voice. The LWV H-F priorities align with those of the national, State, and county. Last year, with the support of LWV Cook County, we championed the initiative for the Pretrial Fairness Act which ended cash bail in Illinois. This leveled the playing field for those without the financial means to post bail. Previously, individuals charged with the same type of crime could be treated differently based on their financial means.

We also worked to ensure the sunset of the Invest in Kids Act that was enacted in 2017 under Governor Rauner. This Act provided a 75% tax credit to contributing individuals and businesses, and subsidized tuition for students in parochial and other non-public schools. The Act was intended to be a positive initiative, however, every tax credit dollar given to an Invest in Kids donor was taken from public funds and should have been used to support public schools.

We can look back with pride at our achievements and will continue to champion the positions of the League of Women Voters at all levels. With this being a presidential election year, our focus will continue to be on registering voters. In the last couple of months, we've conducted registration drives at numerous area high schools, and this campaign will continue. 2025 is also a municipal election year, and in the interest of educating voters on the candidates, we plan to conduct several candidate forums. Your assistance in these processes is appreciated as always.

Presidents' Message (cont'd)

Recently we embarked on an effort to convert our league from a 501(c)(4) to a 501(c)(3) organization. The 501(c)(3) designation will provide a tax advantage for sponsors and contributors who donate to our League to the extent tax laws allow. Under our current designation, only funds designated for the Education Fund are tax-deductible. This conversion has been a lengthy legal process but is expected to be completed by year's end.

And, next year we will be implementing a new, more streamlined membership management system developed by the LWVUS, that will facilitate the engagement of more members, through local, state, and national websites and national membership campaigns. It will include a unified membership dues structure for all Leagues nationwide and will provide the option for members to pay more or less than the suggested fee.

Members are a vital source of organizational power for LWV, carrying out the League's mission on the ground and serving as the organization's strongest base of support. The new system is expected to grow the LWV's membership nationwide in number and diversity so that our organization looks like the people we serve and has the collective power to ensure all voices are heard. More information on the new system will be forthcoming as implementation begins.

Thank you so much members, for your commitment and support. With your active participation, we can continue to make a difference and be an asset to the communities we serve. We look forward to another great year of working with you shoulder-to-shoulder *Empowering Voters and Defending Democracy*

September 19th was *National Voter Registration Day*. Ensuring that every eligible individual has the opportunity to register to vote, is a basic tenet of the League of Women Voters. Our distinguished guest speaker was **Judge Deidre Dyer** who spoke about Voting laws and Voting rights in Illinois and other states. Sand Ridge Nature Center Guided Walk

In October, the LWV H-F Area partnered with the **National Council of Jewish Women** for *The Invest in Kids* school voucher program. This program diverts up to \$75 million from public education and sends public dollars to unaccountable, nontransparent private schools, while over 80% of our public schools in Illinois are underfunded.

We heard from experts who were passionate to fight any attempt at extending Invest in Kids. We had the opportunity to be informed on the issue and take action by contacting our state legislator.

Programs Committee Annual Report (cont'd) February Event:

Black History Month Program

In honor of Black History Month, **Dr. Tenia Davis** presented "The Art of Inspiring Others: A Leader's Guide". Dr. Tenia Davis holds an MBA from Loyola University of Chicago and has also earned a PhD from Benedictine University's Center for Values-Driven Leadership after successfully defending her dissertation titled "The Influence of Organizational Culture on the Display of Servant Leadership." She is also a recognized community leader who expresses particular care and interest in mentoring the next generation of leaders and volunteers. She was recently acknowledged by the United States Senate and received Congressional recognition for her efforts to inspire the world's future leaders. Tenia is also an international businesswoman and has spent much time managing international corporations in multiple locations across the world. We were also entertained by a phenomenal and talented musical family, "**The Beyond.**"

Programs Committee Report March Event:

"Ordinary Women Can Do Extraordinary Things!"

In honor of Women's History Month, our distinguished guest speaker was **Emily Bath**. Mrs. Bath is a wife & mother who wears many hats, including that of Managing Director at Beautycounter, a prominent clean beauty brand that focuses on safety, innovation and advocacy work. Educating and guiding others on the path to minimizing toxicity in their lives has always fueled her fire & she has become more passionate than ever about using her voice to openly share her experiences and knowledge by, as she terms, "learning out loud."

April Event: Earth Month

For our Earth Month meeting, we were honored to have Elizabeth Joy Guscott-Mueller, David Mueller, and Carrie Malfeo who encouraged us to never doubt that a small group can change the world, as they promoted sustainability and reduced use of plastics. We were surprised and disappointed to learn that only a small percentage of plastics are recycled and that most went to landfills or was shipped overseas. We were encouraged to reduce our reliance on plastics, particularly grocery bags, by using our own cloth or other reusable bags.

Voter Services Committee Annual Report

Mary Griffin and Veroncia Amen, Co-Chairs

July -2023 - April 2024

The Voter Services Committee has had a very busy year. Since our last Annual Meeting, we have welcomed several new members into the Voter Services Committee, bringing our committee membership to over 50 members. This is comprised of members who are voter registrars and members who are interested in and/or experienced in conducting candidate forums, either as moderators, timers, or other candidate forum responsibilities.

In August, the Voter Services Committee participated in Hazel Crest's annual Hazelnut Festival as voter registrars. Unfortunately, along with the other vendors, we were rained out and had to shut down early. Nonetheless, we are looking forward to participating in this year's Hazelnut Festival and hoping for better weather.

September 19, 2023, was National Voter Registration Day. The Homewood-Flossmoor League of Women Voters celebrated this national call to action by conducting a GOTV event at Homewood-Flossmoor High School. Working directly with the Director of Student Activities and with the cooperation of the U.S. History and Civics teachers, the Voter Services Committee volunteers were able to register over 100 students. Also, in commemoration of National Voter Registration Day, our Voter Services co-chair, Veroncia Amen, represented the Homewood-Flossmoor League of Women Voters with other voter registrars at Simeon High School in Chicago, where over 100 students were registered there as well.

From October through December 2023, the Voter Services Committee worked on our calendar for the upcoming year. The first event was in February at Hazel Crest's Black History Month program where we once again served as voter registrars. Also in February, the Voter Services Committee of the Homewood-Flossmoor League of Women Voters partnered with Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., at Thornwood High School where we registered eligible 17- and 18-year-olds.

In March, the Homewood-Flossmoor League of Women Voters was invited to participate in the teen voter registration drive, "That's How We Roll, Skate to the Polls," hosted by the South Suburban Chicago Chapter of Jack & Jill of America, Inc. Also joining us was the National Council of Black Women (NCBW). The event was held at the Tinley Park skating rink in Tinley Park, Illinois. It was the last day to register voters online, and it was very productive.

Voter Services Committee Annual Report (cont'd)

Throughout the month of April, the Voter Service Committee was very active. We facilitated voter registration events at Marion Catholic High School, Thornwood High School, Thornton High School, and Thornridge High School. We also served as voter registrars at a Youth Opportunities Fair hosted by Congresswoman Robin Kelly at Hillcrest High school. In addition to these events, we were asked to register voters at Christ Temple Community Baptist Church, and we also accepted the invitation to participate in Delta Sigma Theta Sorority's "Social Action Activated" held at Prairie State Community College where we were present to register voters and to participate in the roundtable discussion on voter-related matters.

Finally, we are presently in the process of scheduling a voter registrar class with the Board of Elections.

Over the next few months, we will continue to pursue voter registration opportunities at local senior homes, summer fairs, farmer's markets, and any other opportunity that avails itself to us.

As we approach our local and national elections in November, we will be focusing, not only on voter registration, but also on preparing for candidate forums. We welcome the support of volunteers from the Voter Services Committee as well as from the general membership in these endeavors.

Sponsorship/Fundraising Committee Annual Report

The Sponsorship/Fundraising Committee was very successful over the last year. Through its advertising Initiative, and Double Good Popcorn Sale, the committee raised over \$3,000.00 to support the League's programs and activities.

September, 2023 The committee decided that fundraising would be the committee's major thrust. To reflect this function, the Committee agreed to changing the name to from Finance Committee to Sponsorship/Fundraising Committee.

October, 2023 In October, the committee met and discussed the development of a Solicitation Letter and Advertising Agreement for businesses to expand their business advertising by utilizing the League's print and social media platforms. The committee agreed that the advertising materials should be completed and sent to the Executive Board for review by October 23. The committee agreed to raise the fee for advertising with the League to \$100. Sandra agreed to present the change to the Executive Board for approval.

December 2023-January, 2024 Advertising Documents, Solicitation Letter and Advertising Agreement, were finalized. Arrangements for mailing were detailed. Documents were to be mailed to area businesses during the week of January 8th.

February, 2024 An update on the Advertising Initiative showed that none of the businesses solicited had responded to the solicitation letter. Pearlene explained the Double Good Popcorn Sales program and her positive experience with it. Pearlene was asked to coordinate this initiative.

March, 2024 As of March, LWVHF had received responses to advertising initiative from Walt's and Flossmoor Brewing Station. Committee members were asked to select 5 businesses to solicit in-person. Double Good Popcorn Sale dates were set from March 25-28. All LWVHF members would be asked to participate.

April 2024. As of that meeting date, the total sales from the Double Good Popcorn sale was over \$4,286.00. 50% of each dollar sold benefited the League. The in-person, follow-up strategy resulted in several new businesses agreeing to advertise with the League. The new partnerships netted over \$900.00 in revenue. In all, the two fundraisers netted over \$3,000.00 in revenue for the League. The Sponsorship/Fundraising Committee makes the following recommendation: that all members participate in the fundraising initiatives in order for the League to realize substantial funding to support our activities, particularly voter services.
