County Offices of Education support school districts with services that can be provided more efficiently and economically at the county level. Examples include staff development and training programs, new curricula, instructional procedures, technology infrastructure and comprehensive business system software for human resources, payroll and finance.

The Butte County Office of Education, in conjunction with the County Superintendent of Schools, provides leadership, service and support to the 14 local districts and all students in Butte County. It also provides a wide range of services, including special and career/technical education, programs, for education, programs, for youth at risk of failure, migrant education, homeless and foster youth and instruction in juvenile detention facilities.

The County Board of Education has responsibility for:

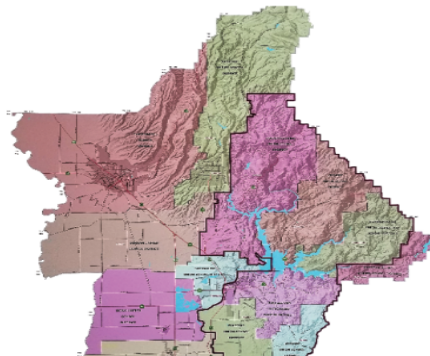
- Approving the annual County Office budget
- Adopting policies governing the operation of the Board
- Acting as the appeal Board for student expulsions
- Acting as the appeal Board for inter-district transfers
- Acting as the appeal Board for charter school petitions
- Establishing the County Superintendent salary
- Approving curriculum for Butte County Office of Education operated schools
- Acting as the County Committee on School District Organization

Geographic area: Located in Northern California. Butte county has 14 school districts in its region.

The 2010 United States Census reported that Butte County had a population of 220,000. The racial makeup of Butte County was 180,096 (81.9%) White, 3,415 (1.6%) African American, 4,395 (2.0%) Native American, 9,057 (4.1%) Asian, 452 (0.2%) Pacific Islander, 12,141 (5.5%) from other races, and 10,444 (4.7%) from two or more races. Hispanic or Latino of any race were 31,116 persons (14.1%).



Cycle of elections: Board members represent different areas of the county. Trustees are elected by the voters at the primary election of even numbered years and serve four-year terms.
