Qualifications and Skills Preferred: No qualifications or skills necessary. We will have bright colored VOTE t-shirts, available at the parade for everyone to wear. If you already have one of these t-shirts, please plan on wearing it. We will have a lot of VOTE signs as well.

Location: Meet at the top of Broad St. at the Y, in Nevada City. The parade ends at Coyote St. near the Nevada City Post Office.

Time Commitment: The parade begins at 2pm, and it goes quickly as it includes only Broad St. However, it often is late in getting started. Expect to be at the top of Broad St. to line up at 1:30pm, and to be finished by 3pm.

Additional Information: We are hoping to have a significant visual impact this year with 100 marchers all carrying the same VOTE sign. It harkens to civil rights marches of the past and will make a stunning and impressive image. Please join us!
