Plastic is convenient, but it is harmful to both our health and our environment. Micro and nano plastics contaminate land, air, and water, as do the chemicals associated with plastic. Scientists are working hard to understand how these pollutants are affecting humans and other organisms. Over the last few years there has been a resurgence of research in this area including startling new discoveries indicating that nano plastics are in our kidneys, lungs, heart, and even brains. How will we tackle this threat to our health and well-being? What actions can we take at the local and state level to inform, motivate, and engage people in our community?
