# 2022 Primary Election

The *Voters' Guide* is published by the League of Women Voters of Frederick County. The League has a long tradition of publishing the verbatim responses of candidates to questions important to voters. The League offers this *Voters' Guide* to assist citizens as they prepare for the election. The League of Women Voters does not support or oppose any candidate or political party.

All candidates were asked to respond to a nonpartisan questionnaire. Candidates running for a particular office were asked identical questions. Responses from candidates who will appear on the Primary Election ballot are printed exactly as submitted. We did not edit for content, spelling, or grammar. All responses were limited to 400 characters and any additional material was cut off at that point. If a candidate did not respond by the mid-May deadline, "No response received by deadline" is printed.

Only voters registered with the Republican or Democratic parties may vote for candidates for most offices, though all voters may vote for Board of Education and some municipal offices. Unaffiliated candidates and candidates from the Green, Libertarian, and Working Class parties are not included in this *Voters' Guide* as they will not appear on the primary election ballot but will be in the *Guide* published for the general election.

Candidate websites provide additional biographical and policy information. If the candidate submitted a campaign website, link it is listed under her/his name.

# By Mail ("Mail-In" or "Absentee" Ballot)

You may request that a ballot be mailed to you or sent via an email link. Apply online or by printing out an application from the State Board of Elections website:

An application for a mail-in ballot must be <u>received</u> by your local Board of Elections

- Tuesday, July 12, 2022 if you want to receive your ballot by mail or fax; or
- **Friday, July 15, 2022**, if you want to download your ballot from the State's website (you must still print and mail the ballot you <u>cannot</u> return it by email).

If you hand deliver your ballot, you must deliver it to your local board of elections or place it in a ballot drop box by **8 pm** on **election day**. The locations of ballot drop boxes are published on your local Board of Elections website (see below).

If you mail your ballot, the envelope must be <u>postmarked</u> on or before primary election day (**July 19, 2022**) and <u>received</u> by your local board of elections no later than **10 am on July 29**, **2022.** NOTE: If you request a mail-in ballot, you will not be permitted to cast an ordinary ballot during Early Voting or on Election Day – you will be provided a provisional ballot that will be counted only if your mail-in ballot is not received.

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# **Governor/Lt. Governor**

**DUTIES:** The Governor is the head of the executive branch and appoints the heads of statewide departments and judges in the state courts. The Governor proposes the annual operating and capital budgets to the legislature and may veto legislation passed by the legislature. The Lieutenant Governor assists the Governor and carries out specific duties assigned by the Governor. The Lieutenant Governor fills the office of Governor in case of death, resignation, or disability.

**TERM:** Four years. Limit of two consecutive terms.

**SALARIES:** Governor \$184,000, Lieutenant Governor \$165,000 as of January 23, 2023. **HOW ELECTED:** Elected statewide as a team.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** The Baker/Navarro ticket is the most experienced in the race, with unrivaled State and local governing experience. Both candidates understand how to get things done in Maryland like few others, precisely because they have done them. They will use this experience to bring together diverse stakeholders from across the State together to address our greatest challenges.

**ECONOMIC INEQUITIES:** The State is the central player in reducing economic disparities, and lifting up the people who have been historically left behind by the people in power. After serving in the Clinton Administration, I founded a nonprofit that sparked a movement to advance evidence-based policymaking—working with the Bush & Obama Administrations to enact major reforms that led to significant gains in wages, education, & more.

**ECONOMIC INEQUITIES:** Wages for the bottom 40% in MD have been stagnant since the 1980s, as income inequality has soared. We'll partner with MD businesses to provide proven job training programs to every adult who wants to advance. Done right, job training can increase earnings 20-40%. The key is to focus on fast-growing industries, and work hand-in-hand with employers who provide paid internships to the trainees.

**PUBLIC SAFETY:** What policies do you favor to reduce crime in Maryland while improving police accountability in communities? We'll fund crime-fighting strategies shown to produce big reductions in violent crime while building community trust, such as Focused Deterrence—an approach targeted at repeat violent offenders. When implemented in Oakland CA, it helped cut homicides by 50%. We'll also invest in community policing in "hot-spots" where half of all urban crime occurs—an approach found to cut crime as much as 25%.

**EDUCATION:** More than <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of MD middle schoolers can't read at a basic level; more than <sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> can't do basic math. We'll expand solutions that are tested and proven to deliver results. For example, we'll raise an army of tutors from the community to help every struggling 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grader in MD—moving them up toward grade level early, before their problems become serious, & reversing COVID-related learning loss.

**HEALTH CARE:** Marylanders are paying 50% more in out-of-pocket healthcare costs than they were 10 years ago, after adjusting for inflation. That's unacceptable. Our administration will negotiate significantly lower prescription drug prices – saving Marylanders up to \$100 million each year – and offer a robust public option health insurance plan cheaper than those currently on the market.

**NATURAL RESOURCES:** MD must lead the nation in cutting carbon emissions. We'll pursue a regional approach, building on the successful Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative — an 11-state cap-and-trade program that's cut power plant emissions 47%. We'll expand this approach to other sectors by joining the Transportation and Climate Initiative (focused on transportation), as part of our comprehensive climate policy.

**INFRASTRUCTURE:** This is critical—our administration will ensure a thorough environmental review precedes implementation of any infrastructure project, and we will not pursue projects that would cause unnecessary or irreparable harm to the environment. From mass transit to highways and other investments, our administration will strike a balance between needed infrastructure and protection of our natural resources.

**OTHER PRIORITIES:** Our campaign is not taking a dime from corporations, PACs, or MD lobbyists, because Maryland deserves a governor who answers to the voters – not special interests. Our administration will also require independent assessments of our key policies – the results of which will be reported to the governor, voters and General Assembly at the same time.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** I have spent the past 16 years serving as the State's Comptroller. My extensive track-record in public service has demonstrated that I know the issues that are unique to Marylanders, and I have successfully implemented solutions to solve their

problems. I am the only candidate that has the statewide experience to hit the ground running on Day 1.

**ECONOMIC INEQUITIES:** The state should help people access job training and placement that lead to stable, lifelong careers. I define the middle class as good wages, healthcare, home ownership, and retirement. I will expand Medicaid coverage, focus on controlling prescription drug prices, and expand Maryland's total cost of care model for the commercial insurance market to control the rising costs. I will also ensure every Marylander is within a 15-minute commute to a Federally Qualified Health Center.

**NATURAL RESOURCES:** One of my greatest concerns is that we do not have a justice oriented approach to addressing environmental concerns. Improving the environment is a matter of effectuating justice. I will remove polluters which are disproportionately placed in communities of color, and provide job training/placement for those who work in industries that will become increasingly obsolete in the new economy.

**INFRASTRUCTURE:** I believe we can walk and chew gum at the same time, and I will implement policies that align our infrastructure initiatives with our environmental goals. That means building more public transit for the economy of tomorrow, while alleviating traffic congestion today. I will also require the entire fleet of state vehicles to convert to electric by the end of my first term.

**OTHER PRIORITIES:** I am committed to building a world-class transit system by reviving the Red Line project and increasing pedestrian/cycling trails. I will make voting more accessible, and secure access to high-speed broadband and 5G wireless technology for every Marylander. All of my policies are integrative, and with my experience I will improve the quality of life of all Marylanders.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Maryland needs a governor with experience to address crime and rebuild our communities, schools, and businesses post-COVID. And now more than ever we must ensure abortion access and support for women. My administration will increase access and affordability by investing in building the pipeline of healthcare professionals, expanding community health centers, and funding reproductive health centers.

The Board of Public Works must approve major contracts for the purchase of goods or service by any department of state government.

The most effective way to deter these scammers is to seek meaningful jail sentences against the worst offenders. This will deter others from scamming and defrauding victims not just fines and desist orders.

**OTHER PRIORITIES:** Reducing crime is my top priority. We must protect our residents and make Maryland a safer place to live and raise a family. Other issues of major concern include environmental crime and pollution, election fraud, elder abuse, and rights of parents. As a past Chairman of the Washington Council of Governments and Vice-Chair of the Legislative Committee of the MD Municipal League, I have held leadership positions. During the past 8 years in the House of Delegates I led significant legislative efforts.

**ECONOMIC INEQUITIES:** It is the state's responsibility to serve all of our constituents, particulary the most vulnerable among us. In Frederick County, 35,291 households (37%) cannot afford basic needs such as housing, transportation, child care, food, healthcare, and technology. Legislative and budget priorities should focus on ensuring that these basic needs are available and affordable for all of our citizens.

**PUBLIC SAFETY:** Law enforcement must foster strong 30ristophe relationships in order to build trust. There is a strong relationship between violent crime and mental illness, thus requiring more treatment options. Police recruitment efforts should eliminate candidates with ingrained prejudices and/or a history of violent behavior. Policies regarding appropriate responses should be mandatory with ongoing training.

**EDUCATION:** I have been a vocal supporter of the Blueprint for Success. In particular, more resources towards mental illness, increased teacher salaries, early childhood learning, and greater allocations of resources to disadvantaged communities are the greatest

priorities. Smaller classroom sizes and stronger training in utilizing technology for remote teaching would have better prepared us for the pandemic.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Prior to my 2018 election to the House of Delegates, I was a community college English professor for 25 years. **ECONOMIC INEQUITIES:** The residents of Maryland, regardless of socio-economic status, have a right to a quality education and affordable healthcare. Maryland has made great progress on these issues. There is still a need for affordable housing and reliable transportation and childcare assistance for Marylanders to take advantage of economic opportunity.

**PUBLIC SAFETY:** In 2021, the General Assembly enacted sweeping police and criminal justice reform that increased citizen involvement and enhanced police accountability. I support a teacher apprentice program that will recruit and train the next generation of teachers at no cost to them.

We have made progress with expanding mental health coverage, telehealth options, and "any willing provider" access for those who are insured and cannot find an in-network provider. More mental health resources are needed in our schools to provide early intervention.

**NATURAL RESOURCES:** Climate change, rising sea levels, unpredictable and weather patterns and increased severe weather along with the health of the Bay are my greatest concerns. The recently enacted Climate Solutions Act reduces Maryland's reduces

greenhouse gas emissions 60% by 2031, in large commercial buildings and multifamily dwellings by 20% by 2030 and will achieve net-zero emissions by 2040.

**LOCAL PROJECTS:** Affordable housing and transportation are priorities in District 3. There are good, high-wage jobs, but the cost of housing and lack of personal transportation, crowded roads and inadequate public transportation make it difficult to take advantage of these employment opportunities. Addressing this requires coordination at all levels of government and a delegation that works well together.

**OTHER PRIORITIES:** Affordable child care, increased funding for music and the arts on par with school sports, creating apprenticeship programs to address healthcare worker and teacher shortages to provide education and training at no cost to the apprentice, increasing locally sources food and addressing food deserts, adding open space, recreation and park land.

**ECONOMIC INEQUITIES:** The state must provide an economic environment in which all people can succeed. Workers deserve a living wage and access to education and training.

I am Director of Operations for a research company with several patents on semi-conductive polymers for green energy uses.

**LOCAL PROJECTS:** We must preserve our agricultural heritage while building a welcoming community. We need strong, supportive, and resilient communities, which welcome all of our neighbors. How does your education and experience prepare you for the duties of this office?

**What policies would you pursue to avoid race discrimination in law enforcement?** I DO NOT believe or agree that racism and discrimination are systemic or prevalent in law enforcement as depicted. Our current policies include psychological screening of new hires, an early warning system to identify racial bias/discrimination; training to include implicit bias/racial sensitivity, hate crimes, and ethics. New laws will require psychological assessments every three years.

# In what situations, if any, would you recommend alternatives to jail time in sentencing?

The soft on crime approach has FAILED, including no bail and lesser sentences. Offenders committing ANY crime of violence, sex crime, or aggravated assault belongs behind bars. Offenders with mental health issues or offenders who are drug users and commit less serious crimes warrant alternatives other than jail like mental health resources or rehabilitation. I stand for law and order.

#### How would you encourage community cooperation in law enforcement?

In this office I encourage my deputies and all personnel to interact with, build trust, know the public we serve and treat them like family. Conversely, the public must understand the role and importance of what we do. The public needs to reset its trust in the integrity of law enforcement, obey the laws we are asked to enforce and simply comply with the lawful orders of an officer.

**What policies would you pursue to avoid race discrimination in law enforcement?** Review policies, compare with actual procedures. Review traffic stop, arrest and complaint data. Share all findings with the public. Have new hires reflect the racial and ethnic makeup our community's growing diversity. Invite community members to take part in in-service training, that addresses race-based policing, alongside deputies to improve communication and develop trusting relationships.

# In what situations, if any, would you recommend alternatives to jail time in sentencing?

I would support alternative sentencing in cases of non-violent crimes, where the offender does not have a record of violent behavior, and involves restitution and court ordered supervision. This permits offenders to actively participate as a productive member of society taking care of family obligations, seeking or maintaining a job, etc. while completing their sentence.

# How would you encourage community cooperation in law enforcement?

Act immediately to build trust. Drawing on my experience, overseeing nationwide training and technical assistance to local police, develop partnerships between deputies and community members. Develop a program on partnership building for deputies that would include community members. Overcrowding is related to development across our county. FCPS must prioritize renovating older buildings with larger student populations while building new schools in areas where overcrowding is significant; and focus on additional solutions with funding sources in local and state government to address student: educator ratios and to increase staffing when class sizes inhibit a quality education.

Student discipline should remain a role of school staff/administrators, not SROs. SROs provide a level of building security as school shootings and threats of student violence are a real concern - but we must ensure stringent application of student's constitutional rights to reduce the school to prison pipeline. I would propose SROs complete the same systemic training around bias as FCPS staff.

# What ideas will you bring to improve the Special Education needs as outlined in the recent Department of Justice report?

The DOJ investigation highlighted a clear under-resourcing of special ed programs. I would start with funding and by connecting with advocates and experts like the Special Education Citizens Advisory Council (SECAC). FCPS has one of the largest average classroom sizes in the state, and the county continues to grow (county pop growth  $\sim 1.5\%/yr$ ) First, all open teaching and SEIA positions must be filled with qualified individuals and then we must retain those employees with competitive salaries and benefits packages. FCPS should continue to work with the City and County governments to plan development wisely. We should continue to lobby the State and County for more construction dollars. When we build new schools, we can plan additions such as was done for Crestwood MS. As a last resort, redistricting is an option, but it is only a temporary one since development does not occur evenly throughout the county.

#### What is your stand on virtual school for illness and hazardous weather days?

I have a mixed view. FCPS will be 1:1 with devices for all students next school year. But I haven't been able to work out the logistics unless devices go home every day. Then there's the potential issue of home internet. Synchronous teaching to allow for student absences requires major technology upgrades in classrooms. That said, the positive is students not missing instruction. A future goal.

# How do you feel about a year-round calendar that may look like - 6 weeks of school, two weeks off – or something similar? Explain.

I am open to looking at it, perhaps having the newly re-formed Citizens Advisory Committee gather information for the Board. Right now though, everyone in education is tired, so I don't think it is the optimal time for major changes, especially with a new Superintendent about to join the school system. However, the calendar needs to be student-focused and based on what is best for our students.

#### Explain your stance on School Resource Officers?

Maryland's Safe to Learn Act requires coordination between school systems and police. I prefer to have officers who have applied to be SROs and who go through the 40 hours of required training rather than officers with little knowledge of how to handle situations with our students in our schools. However, we do need to seek input from students/families who may have concerns and make improvements.

# What ideas will you bring to improve the Special Education needs as outlined in the recent Department of Justice report?

Seclusion has ceased; restraint has decreased. Training is occurring. SEIAs are gaining benefits which is meant to help with the current shortage. More behavioral specialists are being hired. It's a paradigm shift from being reactive to student behaviors to preventing issues in the first place. I would work with the new Superintendent and recommend that she look to FCPS personnel for their ideas.
