Part of what I do as a member of the SelectBoard is that I make it a point to show up to as many of the events, large or small, to attend Town volunteer activities. I really connect with people. I appreciate all of the work that volunteers perform to make our town the wonderful place it is.

I get many phone calls and always return them. I try to facilitate solutions of the many requests and questions I get.
