Our Work Continues

Happy New Year Leaguers! I hope you are enjoying the holidays and recharging your League batteries for our work to empower voters and defend democracy in 2025. Every year is an election year, and this year there are city and school board elections in November, and also a special election in March to fill the lowa City city council District C seat. We also have forums and education programs coming up over the next few months and, of course, opportunities to advocate for League priorities as the Legislative session starts in Des Moines.

The Iowa Legislature convenes on January 13. The Governor gives her Condition of the State address on January 14 at 6 p.m. - tune in to hear what priorities the Governor has for legislators to address. Our Advocacy committee will follow the Legislative session closely to understand pending legislation related to our state policy priorities. If you would like to join them or sign up to receive action alerts, contact our Advocacy chair Kathy Wandro.

The Voter Services committee hosts the Legislative forums during the legislative session to give you a chance to hear from and question our Johnson County state legislators. The first forum is scheduled for Saturday, January 25 at 9:30 a.m. at the Iowa City Senior Center and will focus on Education. The forum February 22 will focus on the Environment and Water Quality, while the forum on March 29 will focus on Immigration and Citizenship. All forums are at the Iowa City Senior Center and begin at 9:30 a.m. Please mark your calendars and plan to attend.

LWVIA co-president Terese Grant will be speaking at a forum in Cedar Rapids on January 3 sponsored by the Interfaith Alliance of Iowa titled Bridging the Gap: Political Advocacy from Afar. The forum offers both in-person and virtual attendance. More information is at https://www.interfaithallianceiowa.org/getinvolved/intersections. Consider attending to hear how to hone your advocacy skills in preparation for the upcoming lowa legislative session.

ChapterSpot News

As you are probably aware, *ChapterSpot*, the new membership platform where members from across the country will join, renew online, pay dues, and update their own personal information such as phone, email and mailing address when needed is coming in February, 2025

Changes: All members will need to create a *ChapterSpot* account. Therefore, the first week in February all members will receive an email from The League of Women Voters US inviting them to log-in and set up a *ChapterSpot* account. A member will create an account using a valid email, i.e., the email our League currently has on file for you. Members will enter their email and receive a code which is then entered in order to create a *ChapterSpot* account. Any information already on file with the League, i.e., name, address and phone number will be prepopulated in the form.

There will also be a short questionnaire to complete.

Dues Changes

Rather than each League setting its own dues range, under the new system dues will be paywhat-you-can with a recommended member rate of \$75. The minimum dues rate will be \$20. There will no longer be either a student rate or household membership rate. However, a household may choose to continue to pay the previous \$105 household total amount membership between them; or the recommended amount of \$50 each; or pay any amount down to the minimum of \$20 each. As always, there are no dues for Lifetime members.

Automatic Dues Renewal

There will be an option to renew dues automatically. Members are encouraged to pay dues online using a credit/debit card or by ACH (an electronic payment using the numbers on the bottom of a check). As a reminder to renew, members will receive a dues renewal reminder 60 days and 30 days before a person's membership expires. Another reminder will be emailed if a member has not renewed by the member expiration date. Members will still be able to renew with a check.

A major benefit of the new system is that local leagues will now receive a higher percentage of membership dues. Under the new system, the percentage received will be National, 33%; State, 47%; and Local, 20%.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Affordable housing, reproductive justice, and the challenges immigrants face in obtaining legal and medical services are all on the program schedule for Winter/Spring 2025. Please mark your calendars for these educational programs and check the events calendar for time and place.

Affordable housing has emerged as a major issue in Johnson County as it has across the country. On February 13, 2025, Affordable Housing: Searching for Solutions will bring together Jessica Andino, Executive Director of the Johnson County Affordable Housing Coalition, Rachel Carr from Johnson County Social Services, and Christine Hays from Shelter House to discuss the extent of the affordable housing crisis locally; the people most affected by this shortage; current efforts to address the issue; and proposals to make housing more accessible.

Locating Reproductive Justice, a two-day symposium on March 27 - 28, 2025, will bring leading thinkers, activists and artists to the University of Iowa to discuss regional and global shifts in the realm of reproductive justice. LWVJC is one of several co-sponsors joining the Reproductive Justice and Maternal Politics Obermann Group to support a series of events, including two public evening programs at the Iowa City Public Library. Look for more information in the February *Voter*.

While politicians and media relentlessly focus on undocumented immigrants crossing the U.S. - Mexico border, we will delve into Legal and Medical Issues Facing Immigrants in Johnson County on April 3, 2025. Bram Elias of the University of Iowa Immigration Clinic and Jennie Schmidt of the Free Medical Clinic will enlighten us on some very real challenges immigrants face locally and how these two public services are helping them.


CARRIE CHAPMAN CATT BOOK GROUP

★ VOTING



Promote equal access to voting and ensure all votes are counted. Adopt automatic voter registration. Enact ranked choice voting. Pass a constitutional amendment allowing lowans with felony convictions to vote after time served. End electoral college.

TRANSPARENCY & CITIZENSHIP



Demand government accountability and transparency by requiring all amendments and bills discussed in committee to be available to the public prior to a vote. Demand timely processing of Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests. Encourage direct citizen participation by continuing virtual committee and subcommittee meetings. Reinstate gender balance requirements for appointed boards and commissions.

器EDUCATION

Provide oversight and track public funds being used for non-public schools. Require any non-public school receiving public funds to meet the same standards as public schools. Fully fund public schools and reinstate all AEA functions. Continue to expand access to affordable childcare and free four-year-old preschool.

REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS



Guarantee access to the full range of women's reproductive health services. Repeal the six-week abortion ban. Make contraception available without prescription and promote programs that help prevent unplanned pregnancies. Ensure Medicaid services are comprehensive and accessible. Set policies that attract maternal health professionals and address the state's OB/GYN deserts.

(III) HUMAN TRAFFICKING



Increase state funding for victim services; develop strategies to prevent human trafficking, domestic violence, and sexual assault; and enact "Safe Harbor" legislation to protect victims from criminal prosecution.

& ENVIRONMENT



Recognize the need for and fund water quality initiatives. Fully fund REAP. Develop state climate change strategies.

GUN SAFETY



Enact comprehensive common sense gun safety legislation. Ban assault rifles and military-grade weapons. Enact background checks on all gun sales, close gun show loopholes, require gun safety locks, repeal "stand your ground" law, and oppose legislation that allows the carrying of guns in schools.
