## I. Introduction.

The meeting of the County Council was called to order by Council President Dan Brady at 5:03 pm with all members present. It lasted approximately 55 minutes.

## **II.** Antecedents, Announcements and Public Comment.

County Executive Budish announced that the <u>Greater Cleveland Partnership</u> supports the <u>HHS levy</u> and there will be a kickoff the next day at Metrohealth. Just one citizen made a public comment regarding public safety.

# **III. Business Transacted.**

\* Resolutions adopted at this meeting included the following:

-- Appointment of Honey Bell-Bey as <u>Poet Laureate</u> for Cuyahoga County. Under **Notes** there is a link to news coverage of this event. It was very well attended, with very moving speeches.

-- Confirmation of Michael W. Chambers as Fiscal Officer of Cuyahoga County

-- Appointment to <u>Western Reserve Area Agency on Aging</u> Board of Trustees and various individuals to <u>Cuyahoga Community College</u> Board of Trustees

-- \$3 million for design engineering to rehab the <u>Hilliard Road bridge</u> over Rocky River and the Valley Parkway;

-- \$1 million in revenue to lease two Head Start sites to the Council for Economic Opportunity;

-- \$1.1 million for Cognitive Behavioral Interventions for Offenders Seeking Employment;

-- \$4 million to the Prosecutor's office for 2020 legal services;

-- \$1.4 million so that the Board of Developmental Disabilities can determine eligibility for reimbursement of <u>Medicaid Home and Community-based Services</u>.

-- \$3.6 million in additional funds to 19 providers of OPTIONS for Independent Living

\* Resolutions introduced and referred to committees included the following:

-- \$3 million for rehabilitation of Tinkers Creek Road in Walton Hills and Maple Heights

-- \$4 million for replacement of <u>Mastick Road Bridge</u> in Fairview Park

-- Following amounts for Invest in Children Program

\$1.3 million for Early Childhood Mental Health Program

\$3.9 million for Special Needs Child Care Program

\$1.4 million for Family Child Care Home Professional Development System
