

your volunteering. Seems like ages ago...we didn't know how good we had
it. Now we do and we are looking forward to better days ahead and an in-

- Communications: We welcomed two NEW members, Kathy Moore and more recently, Jen Ruiz. Thanks to Kathy, the League is now on Instagram at <a href="Iwvofclallamcounty">Iwvofclallamcounty</a>. Check it out! Jen has expressed interest in communicating voter registration opportunities to the community and we are looking forward to her participation. THANK YOU, League members, for participating in the recent Membership Survey. We received great feedback from you that we will put to good use.
- **Education:** Kids Voting USA update: We were disappointed to hear that the State League decided not to take over *Kids Voting USA* and make it available to all students and Leagues in Washington. They felt the challenges were: paper ballots vs. on-line voting; the agreement requirements of Kids Voting USA; and sustainability. After hearing this, we wrote a grant for State Education Fund money to cover the \$600 yearly cost here in Clallam County. That grant was denied. At the time of this writing, we have not been invoiced by *Kids Voting USA*. Bonnie will contact the lead KVUSA person to see if she can do curriculum writing work again this year to cover this year's \$600 fee. We plan to continue the program for the 2020-21 school year and hope to include more teachers in Clallam County although the teacher workshops will need to be offered via zoom this fall. The education committee will meet via zoom later this summer to discuss if and how we'll be able to keep the program going in Clallam County in the future. In other Civics Education news, a new League-sponsored Washington State History textbook for 4<sup>th</sup> grade is progressing according to

schedule and we hope to get information out to schools in Clallam County as soon as it's available. Please take a moment to check out the fantastic *Kids Voting USA* program and share with interested schools/teachers.




• Environment Committee: We are looking for a member to head up this Committee. This team studies local water, sustainability, climate change issues, and creates educational outreach programs for the public. Interested? Post COVID, we plan to continue with our collaborative outreach program The Story of Water, designed to educate our local community about the water challenges facing Clallam County in maintaining a healthy and sustainable water supply for personal, agricultural and business consumption. the film and video recordings of presentations can be found on The Story of Water webpage.



 Healthcare: Affordable healthcare for all, local availability of all legal services (reproductive health care), end of life and mental health services, and maintaining OMC as public, secular hospital is the focus of this Committee. In August we'll hold a Zoom meeting with these (tentative) agenda items: teeing up healthcare access questions to ask candidates during the League's fall election forums; re-starting our individual meetings with each OMC Board member; and asking Clallam Public Health Officer Unthank if there is a role the Committee could play in supporting her current efforts re: COVID.

- Voter Services: We've been super-busy planning for, setting up, and facilitating virtual Candidate forums via Zoom. As soon as the forum recordings are available for viewing, we'll post them on the <u>Candidate</u> <u>Forums page</u> towards the end of July. Just this weekend Susan Hillgren of <u>The Answer For Youth (TAFY)</u> contacted the League to ask for their assistance in registering people to vote. - Welcoming: Glad to report that our Committee is no longer a one-man band we've had two more members join our committee Marjorie Whitmore and Nell Clausen. Although we are missing the personal contact with new members at this time, we now have an online LWV orientation that allows us to welcome and educate new members in this time of COVID. Note: Members have to log on to the Member's Only section of the website to access the link to the online orientation. On June 26 we presented our first Zoom orientation with new members Ellen Sukolsky, Monica Dixon, Francis Leslee, Pat Tomlin, Jen Ruiz, Bill Buchan, and Elizabeth Althair. There were a few glitches but we are happy to report that it mostly went well. We'll be even happier in the future to return to our usual in-person coffee-house and muffin orientations.





#### **Book Club Selections**

After a many-months hiatus, the LWV Book Group will meet virtually via Zoom on July 14th, with Margie Whitmore leading us in a discussion of <u>The Heartbeat of</u> **Wounded Knee** by David Treuer. In this time of heightened awareness of the

injustices suffered by non-whites in the United States, it was good to broaden our focus. This book shattered many myths about Native American life, presenting instead a narrative of survival, resilience and resourcefulness. The author's research delves into the earliest presence of Indians on the North American continent, and then focuses on the story of what Indian lives, struggles, and accomplishments have been in the years since the 1890 massacre of Lakota Sioux at Wounded Knee Creek in South Dakota.

The book selected for discussion at our September 8 meeting is <u>How to Hide an</u> <u>Empire</u> by Daniel Immerwahr. Most nations do not own territory in other countries. Russia has 9 bases abroad. The United States currently holds 800 properties around the world. Our meeting location (Sunland or virtual) will be determined later.

### Lt. Governor Debate July 15th

There's a very real possibility if Joe Biden wins the Presidential election, that Governor Inslee may be appointed to a post in his cabinet. For that reason alone, you may wish to watch the recording of the virtual debate between candidates in the primary race for Lt. Governor. (Here's the

The debate will follow a nonpartisan and impartial format, with candidates given equal time to respond to a set of screened questions. The questions will touch on a variety of topics of interest to Washington State voters, such as the state's public health and economic response to COVID-19, the candidate's legislative priorities, and the candidate's preparedness to accede to the governorship in case of a vacancy.
