Questions From The Community:

1) Please state your position on the new MBTA housing legislation impact to the current elementary school landscape in HW.

The MBTA zoning law is mandated by the State and requires all towns to create a multi-unit zone (which is a minimum of 15 units that are to be built on one acre of land that is within a ½ mile from the MBTA station), as a way to address the housing crisis in our state. Even though our town is currently not required to build additional housing, I am confident that our Planning and Zoning Boards will work together to adopt a new zoning law that permits any requests that come from the state, to be compliant. As a Select Board Member, I will work to ensure that all Wenham residents are correctly informed of the state requests, the options positioned by the town boards and listen to all community concerns regarding the developments prior to any decision being made.

2) What do you feel your responsibilities would be as a member of the Select Board?

I believe that the responsibilities of a Select Board member are to be an accessible, dependable, respectful and communicable member as part of a diversified voting board that represents the citizens of Wenham at every meeting and on every issue, while working to enact laws and policies consistent with state law,

regulating local and municipal affairs. In 2023, Wenham residents voted to increase the Select Board members from the original three members to five, with the desire to create a more diverse board in demographics, professional and community experiences. In this position, I will bring the diversity that the board needs, keep an open mind to all viewpoints, create new ways of forward thinking, be well-researched, come prepared to all meeting by obtaining facts and a full understanding of issues at hand and represent the people of Wenham equally to the best of my ability.

3) Describe the values you would bring to the town of Wenham?

I will apply my entire skill set, a combination of my professional, entrepreneurial, community, and motherly competencies, as well as my integrity, honesty and loyalty to this position. - **Family**. It is essential that families are supported in the community, through schools, building more resources at the recreation center and improved social services regardless of their family dynamic, race, religion or living situation!
