Ally vs. Partner?

Ally

- An ally is any person who supports, empowers, or stands up for another person or a group of people.
- Example: someone joining a group where they don't fit the target demographic (e.g., male joining LWV)
- When you give support to others, you are developing allies for your own groups and causes--in fact there is probably no better way to make an ally than to be one to someone else.

<u>Partner</u>

- A person or group who is associated with another group in a common activity or interest.
- Example: a League joining with another voter registration organization to achieve their shared project/goal.
- One of the best ways to be effective is to use partner as a verb, rather than as a noun.

Why Work in Partnership?
