On November 16th from noon to 1p.m. the League of Women Voters of the Lewisburg Area's Educational Forum series presents a virtual talk by Sue Ellen Henry, Professor of Education at Bucknell University. OCTOBER FORUM

On October 19th, Judith Grisel, a behavioral neuroscientist and Bucknell Professor of Psychology spoke on Neuroscience and the Experience of Addiction. A recording of this talk is available on our LWVLA Website at: <u>LWVLewisburgArea.org/whats-happening/</u> <u>what-you-missed</u>

Dr. Grisel's recent book, *Never Enough, The Neuroscience and Experience of Addiction*, also addresses this topic.

Dr. Grisel reviewed relevant neuroanatomy and neurophysiology along with the concept of homeostasis. Substance abuse disorders are mental illnesses and very lethal. The CDC reports a record high of more than 96,779 overdose deaths in the United States for the 12 month period ending March of 2021. Causes of addiction include genetic, with many genes influencing vulnerability; environmental, such as surrounding culture, peers, stressors; and developmental, including adolescence, with less well developed prefrontal cortex, need for autonomy, low impulse control and more risk taking. Ninety percent of individuals who have a problem with addiction start before age eighteen. She shared stories to illustrate the facts

Subsequent discussion included the limited therapeutic value of cannabinoids; considerations involved in legalization and mixed messages involved; and the particular risk of early use of alcohol/binge drinking. Barbara Kolmen, Forum Committee

Tuesday, February 8, 2022, 10a.m. Sum of Us: What Racism Costs Everyone and How We Can Prosper Together (Heather McGhee, 2021)

The title says it all. This book explores inequality from a different perspective: Racism has a cost for everyone, not just for people of color. McGhee finds proof of what she calls the Solidarity Dividend.

Vote411.org

Are you still unfamiliar with Vote411?

Vote411.org is the national voting information website sponsored by the League of Women Voters. 411 is the number for information, similar to 911 being the number for emergencies.

Vote411 = voting information

Why use Vote411.org in addition to the *Voters Guide*?

- Candidates provide information in their own words, directly to Vote411, unedited by the League of Women Voters. We use that information to make our printed Voters Guide. On the Vote411.org website, when candidates submit changes, their information is updated quickly, so even after the Voters Guide has been printed, you read what is most current.
- 2. The <u>Vote411.org</u> website takes you directly to races on your ballot, when you enter a street address in the "Find Out What's on Your Ballot" field. Your address is not saved; it is used solely to pinpoint the correct races in your area.
