FROM THE PRESIDENT

What an extraordinary month we have had! It is one for the history books!!!! January 6th, 2021 will be forever burned in our collective memories along with December 7th, 1941 and September 11th, 2001.

On January 8th, 2021, the LWVUS posted a decisive statement regarding their stance on the removal of Donald Trump from office. This announcement resulted in varying responses from members and the community. Locally, reactions were mostly positive, some thoughtful, and at least one negative. I think it is worth noting that the League does not consider its position as a political statement in terms of Democratic, Republican, or Independent viewpoint.

Our job, at all levels, is to empower voters and defend Democracy. It has been that way for over 100 years. It should be no surprise that the National League would have a strong point of view surrounding attempts at overturning an election and thus disenfranchising millions of voters, and of the acts of violence targeted at obstructing the very work of the Democracy.

In the past several months, we have witnessed our democracy under attack. At times, it may have seemed that it was on life-support, with many factions fighting to see who could pull the plug first. The League must fight for democracy with our strongest and most effective weapon...information. It is incumbent upon us not only to inform the electorate but also to help our elected officials fulfill their commitments to their constituents. In short, we must do our best to be good citizens and enable our neighbors to do the same.

The League is non-partisan. We work very hard to maintain that status. This is no simple feat considering the current hyper-political environment in which we live. Each member, as a responsible citizen, has unique personal feelings and political leanings. That is each person's right and privilege. It does, however, leave the League open to criticism for being biased.

The leadership of the LWVLA is very aware of this perception. Over the next several months, we will move toward the implementation of the Strategic Plan. We will be ever committed to continuing our non-partisan work while being cognizant of the individual rights of our members.
