I believe in educating voters about their new rights to vote from home, sending absentee ballot request forms to every registered voter in the state, and creating an online, downloadable application to request your absentee ballot online. We implemented several secure protocols to ensure every valid ballot and only valid ballots were counted and will continue to do so if reelected.

Many voters' express concerns to me about the appointment program at the branch offices saying they often wait longer than expected. If this office plans to continue the appointment program, we need to look at ways of better honoring the scheduled times	I would work with county clerks to help them publish more updated and accurate election information on their county government website. I would also work with local election officials to provide improved equipment to accommodate alternative voting methods and provide better training with regard to handling minor party paperwork.	I advocate requiring paper ballots for voting so that any recounts can be done using physical objects rather than voting by touch screen. I advocate for election reforms that level the playing field for independent and third-party candidates. These include using ranked choice voting, allowing counties, townships, and villages to conduct nonpartisan elections, and making the signature requirements for independent candidates the same as Democrats and Republicans. I support the current system of absentee voting for any reason, early voting, and same day voter registration and will push back against any efforts to make voting more difficult.

I was educated in our district and proudly voted in the Senate to return the investment by delivering an historic K-12 budget that provides more equitable funding among public school districts.

The crisis response to the pandemic implemented short-term fixes to our major economic gaps. I am a strong supporter of energy efficiency and renewable energy. We cannot continue to be reliant on outdated and dangerous forms of energy and need to look towards the future.

I am the co-chair of the Poverty and Homelessness Caucus, working with the Governor's Taskforce on Poverty to take their specific recommendations to reduce poverty and turn them into legislation or change through departmental action. As a state and as a country, we must continuously work to dismantle racist systems and amplify the voices of people of color, the LGBTQ+ community, and women in all levels of government and society. For too long, the Michigan Legislature has attacked marginalized communities. We must elect leaders who will fight for civil rights and against inequality.

Gun violence is a public health crisis and we need to treat it as such. As the senator representing Oxford and the Senate Chair of the Firearm Safety and Violence Prevention Caucus, I have worked extensively on this issue. Bills I have introduced include: universal background checks, Red Flag laws, a ban on high capacity magazines, requiring safe storage of firearms, and banning firearms in the Michigan Capitol. While none of these bills have been given a hearing, I have not stopped working and pushing on the Senate Majority Leader to act on these bills.

First, we must acknowledge that any change in voting procedures that would result in a legal voter having their vote suppressed is just as harmful to the integrity of our elections as a fraudulent vote that is counted. So I oppose any change to our elections that would prevent more legal votes than illegal ones (recognizing that fraudulent voting is effectively non-existent, meaning the current safeguards are sufficient). Aside from that, I support reforming our elections, to have ranked-choice voting, and I support policies that work to remove the corrupting influence of campaign donations.

I strongly support policies that acknowledge the externalities found in our carbon-based energy system, where businesses place the cost burden on the public to account for their activity, rather than paying for it themselves. So at the national level, I'd like to see a carbon tax. One thing I'd like to see our state do to protect our resources is to first acknowledge that property rights are not so unconstrained as to allow a corporation to pull unlimited water from the ground without paying for it, so I'd want to see a 1 cent/gallon tax on companies bottling our water and selling it.

As a Realtor, I recognize the lasting consequences from past policies, such as the racist policy of redlining. My grandparents could purchase a home wherever they wanted, but some of my peers can not say the same. And the harms from those policies still exist, so I would want to see the state government provide extra resources and funding to those areas, to help bring up their property values to be comparable to others nearby that weren't harmed by redlining. I think that is a moderate approach to addressing current inequities, as it's about geography which was undeniably and specifically targeted for racist purposes.

The first step is to place the same liability on someone who gives a firearm to someone else that we place on someone who gives alcohol to someone else -- if the person they're giving that firearm to isn't legally allowed to possess it, then the supplier should be criminally liable (just like giving alcohol to a minor). When it comes to the firearms themselves, it would be preferable for it to be addressed at the national level, but I recognize that there is a difference between firearms designed for defense, and those designed for combat, and the latter should be regulated like fully-automatic firearms.

I also support the Michigan Campaign Finance Act, which regulates political activity, campaign financing and restricts contribution and expenditures. Campaign statements and reports are required and also should regulate anonymous contributions as well as campaign advertising and literature.

The Michigan House has passed more than two-dozen common sense election integrity bills based, primarily, on the Office of the Auditor General's report. Voter ID has been Michigan law for a long time. There's no point in having a comprehensive Qualified Voter File if it is not implemented at the time people are actually voting. The QVF is only as good as the data that has been entered. Regular and thorough additions, updates and deletions must be completed by local and county clerks. Signature verification, against a quality state QVF, is essential for all absentee ballot applications and submissions.

I'm in support of the Michigan Natural Resource and Environmental Protection Act, which protects the environment and natural resources of the state to regulate the discharge of certain substances into the environment, regulates use of certain land and water and other natural resources of the state, protects people's rights to hunt and fish; and to prescribe power and duties of certain state to local agencies and officials. With respect to renewable energy and energy efficiency, it's imperative that we expand the manufacturing of electric vehicles in the U.S. I'm also in support of funding renewable energy projects.

Water and air pay no attention to international, state or county borders. A comprehensive agreement between Canada, the US and all Great Lakes states must be enhanced and strictly enforced. Air quality standards need to be regionally and nationally agreed upon, as well. Energy efficiency cannot be decoupled from energy reliability. The excessive land-use footprint, transmission expense and lineloss, and production intermittency make wind and solar poor choices. Natural gas generation is the primary reason behind US world-leading reductions in emissions. Michigan must become a leader in nuclear power generation and embrace new technologies.

Q: What actions and policies would you recommend to improve our education system?

We must provide every child with an excellent education to set them up for a great future and so that our state and nation continue to thrive with innovation and prosperity. Our schools are failing at this job in a big way, and it is completely unacceptable. People must be held accountable for this critical job of educating our youth. We must get back to excellence in reading, writing, arithmetic, and accurate American history and civics. We must get back to explicit phonics. 3rd grade reading proficiency went from 75% pre-Common Core (2010) to 44% 10 years in! Children must be able to read to learn. See my website for my extensive plan.

The public education in Michigan is inarguably dismantled and in great need of reconstruction. The pathway toward better education and excellence MUST come from the basics: reading (learning), writing (communication & comprehension), and arithmetic (critical thinking). My sole task is to promote policy to Educate, Not Indoctrinate, Not Incarcerate, & Not Cremate! Literacy is the most important success factor and the goal for which public education is expected to achieve. Literacy is defined simply as the ability to read & write. The state board should have minimal interference in local education. At the same time, they led us to try new and innovative approaches, some of which were successful and should be encouraged. We learned that in many cases home, private and charter schools should be incentivized, as they are much more flexible than traditional public schools and deliver superior educational results. One-size-fits-all edicts from the State are inferior to policies developed by parents, teachers and schools to address local needs and goals. Hybrid or remote schooling methods work well for some but not all.

Q: What are the most pressing issues facing the State Board of Education and what actions would you take regarding them?

The most pressing issue facing the SBE is its lack of fulfilling its role. We must return the board to its constitutional purpose, and we must get our schools back to providing an excellent education for all children. Everybody needs to understand the power and accountability structure of MI schools so we can get it working again. Children only get one chance at a K-12 education, and we must get it right. Local boards also need to be educated on their critical role, and we must get back to parental rights and local control. There is a reason our founding fathers did not want national control in education, and we are seeing it play out.

The Michigan State Board of Education is responsible for K-12 education and community colleges. Working with the Michigan Legislature and Governor, the SBE is essential in recommending funding and guidance. The most pressing issue facing the Michigan State Board of Education is the lack of guidance in supporting parents, students, & responding to obvious failures in Michigan's public education. Spending like drunken sailors on programs that don't lead to LITERACY will take our already pathetic academic ranking even lower! All available resources should go to literacy, keeping schools safe and protected & cooperating with PARENTS (MCL 380.10).

Again, the department's primary role should be to support and make recommendations to local school districts.

The most pressing issues facing Michigan schools involve the balancing act between respecting educators, and at the same time honoring parents. I believe all courts should safely return to in-person court, move through the backlog, and use virtual court when necessary.

Greater access to justice in both criminal and civil justice systems are the biggest needs. For example, in order for public defenders to fairly represent their clients in criminal proceedings they need the tools and resources to conduct a proper investigation of the facts. I'm often asked why I would run for elected office in a political environment as nasty and divisive as ours. My answer is always the same: We need good people of good character to step up for these positions. I lead the appeals group at one of Michigan's top law firms, clerked for a top federal judge, graduated from Cornell and Georgetown Law, and have served as lead counsel in more than 150 cases in the Michigan Supreme Court and Court of Appeals.

The Supreme Court needs Justices who will apply the law as written, not as it ought to be written in the mind of the Judge. My background in the law for over forty years has taught me the importance of this purpose. My experience in the practice of law before judges has taught me that judges are sometimes reluctant to simply apply the law as written. I can bring a balanced respect for the written law and the Constitution in particular to the bench, so that Justice may be done.

Article VI of the Michigan Constitution provides the Court exercise only judicial power, including superintending control, adopting rule of practice and procedure, and to issue written decisions in cases and controversies that come before it. In so doing it must secure the rights of the people by confining the government's power strictly within its Constitutional boundaries. It does not enjoy any power to make law or carry the law into execution. It does not enjoy any power to substitute its own political matrix for that of the parties, the legislature or Governor. It has no power to insert new rights into the Constitution.

The future of the judicial system is for the People to decide, but that future must recover a solid commitment to the rule of law, not the law of judges. Michigan Lawyers must also be freed from the politicized State Bar of Michigan by elimination of compulsory membership. The Supreme Court should be leading this fight. Instead, it sides with the Bar. It compels lawyers to pay money to the Bar for the propagation of ideas with which they disagree. The Court also tramples down the natural rights of conscience in the process. Securing natural rights is the states only compelling interest.

Q: Why are you running for the Michigan Supreme Court and how do your educational, occupational, civic and community experiences qualify you to serve on this court?

I am the only member of the Court to bring prior trial court and appellate court experience to the job. Having tried hundreds of cases and reviewed on appeal thousands more, I possess a wealth of experience and knowledge relating to the proper application of statutes and court rules to cases. Q: Describe, in lay terms, what the Michigan Supreme Court does and the challenges it faces. How would you address these challenges?

The primary function of the Court is to interpret Michigan law. Courts do not make law. Elected legislative representatives make our laws. The greatest challenge for the Court is to state what the law is and not what we think the law ought to be. Judicial restraint accomplishes this challenge while acknowledging that equal justice under law is the foundational promise of our legal system. Equal justice under law can only be achieved when litigants can be confident that judges will restrain themselves to the proper interpretation of the law.

Q: What, in your opinion, are the two greatest areas of need in the Michigan justice system, and how should the Supreme Court respond to them?

Too many people are denied meaningful access to the civil justice system because they cannot afford a lawyer. These cases involve very important issues, like housing, domestic disputes and debt collection. I chair a commission that is developing strategies to narrow this justice gap by rethinking the delivery of legal assistance. 1. Under its own governance guidelines, the OCC Board has made itself so that it only has symbolic power. Namely, it only gets involved in big picture issues and has barred itself from getting involved in any particular details of implementation--or with any other person at the college other than the Chancellor. I know that this model does not make sure that students, faculty, staff, or taxpayers are heard or championed. If elected, I would simply refuse to be bound any such limits, except as mandated by ethics or law. 2. Currently, OCC only offers a paltry 20% tuition discount to seniors over the age of 60, when the Michigan law allows for free tuition. My campaign has already been in contact with OCC (and other Michigan colleges). My proposal for better tuition for seniors (at little cost to taxpayers) is already on the OCC agenda. 3. Much of OCC's current enrollment is online. If elected, I would work to ensure that our programs are competitive with other online offerings.

1) Keeping tuition affordable. Researching what other community colleges charge for tuition, we have kept OCC's tuition one of the lowest in the state and I would continue to do so if reelected.

2) Creating more community education or enrichment courses. Working with the staff at OCC to encourage community outreach to seek out what areas could be added for the community's benefit. When I have attended various community functions, I ask what the college could create to enhance its enrichment offerings and pass this information along to those in charge. I would continue to do this type of outreach if reelected.

3) Since the college has been going through and will continue to go through renovations, the college needs to be fiscally responsible to the tax payers of Oakland County with its expenditures. I am on all of the construction steering committees to help ensure that this happens. I will continue to do so if reelected.

(1) Infrastructure & Assets – Planning & Executing on infrastructure: sewers & water, streets, sidewalks & parks, dams & ponds. Identifying our goals for each is important, and all need a plan before we can execute (see planning below). (2) Staffing & Services – We recently hired a new Village Manager who brings great experience and is an excellent fit for our community. Helping to identify staffing & training needs will improve service delivery for residents. Reviewing how the work of the village is accomplished should be done periodically, and it is time. We have begun the review of our professional services vendors. Other Village services need to be reviewed as well.

(3) Planning – Infrastructure planning is a must, and we just received the grant to do that work. Any coming work or expenditure in our community should be identified, prioritized and planned for. Water & sewer issues are complex and have regional ties. Better to plan for the need than to react to an emergency.

(1) The Village needs to devote more time coordinating and implementing a plan to repair and replace our aging infrastructure. A new Infrastructure Board (like the Parks & Rec Board) should be created to act as an advisory liaison between the residents and Council. This Board would flesh out questions like: "Do we as a community want a roundabout at Beverly and Southfield?" Additionally, there are specific MMRMA risk control measures that residents could use to protect against future flooding. The proposed Board could coordinate and disseminate this info to residents to reduce loss (backflow preventers), teach proper post flood clean up (to avoid disease), and appropriate home owner insurance riders to mitigate post flood financial loss. (2) Public Safety: I would request regular Council updates from the DPS Director until such time as our short staffing is cured. (3) Create a "Customer Service" plan to re-dedicate a spirit of open communication and transparency with the residents.

3) Be Transparent and Responsive - the school board and administration are not responsive to requests made repeatedly by parents and community members. Often responses come only after multiple FOIAs; meetings are

Statewide Proposal 22-1

A proposal to amend the state constitution to require annual public financial disclosure reports by legislators and other state officers and change state legislator term limit to 12 total years in legislature

This proposed constitutional amendment would:

- Require members of legislature, governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, and attorney general file annual public financial disclosure reports after 2023, including assets, liabilities, income sources, future employment agreements, gifts, travel reimbursements, and positions held in organizations except religious, social, and political organizations.
- Require legislature implement but not limit or restrict reporting requirements.
- Replace current term limits for state representatives and state senators with a 12-year total limit in any combination between house and senate, except a person elected to senate in 2022 may be elected the number of times allowed when that person became a candidate

Statewide Proposal 22-2

- Establish new individual right to reproductive freedom, including right to make and carry out all decisions about pregnancy, such as prenatal care, childbirth, postpartum care, contraception, sterilization, abortion, miscarriage management, and infertility;

Local Proposals

OAKLAND COUNTY

Oakland County Public Transportation Millage

A proposal to authorize Oakland County to levy a millage for the purpose of funding public transportation services in Oakland County, including operating, maintaining, improving, and expanding transit services, creating and expanding new fixed routes for bus service connecting local communities, expanding transportation services for seniors, veterans, and people with disabilities, and providing transportation to get employees to jobs, patients to healthcare, students to colleges and universities, for the general public to have more transportation options, and for related purposes authorized by law.

This millage would be levied at a maximum rate of .95 mills (95 cents per \$1,000 in taxable value) for a period of 10 years beginning in 2022 and ending in 2031.

This millage would replace an expiring millage levied by the Oakland County Public Transportation Authority supporting the Suburban Mobility Authority for Regional Transportation (SMART), and fund replacement of other local public transportation millages.

If this new millage is approved and levied, revenue will be distributed to Oakland County, SMART, North Oakland Transportation Authority (NOTA), Older Persons' Commission (OPC), and the Western Oakland Transportation Authority (WOTA). It is estimated that \$66,163,000 will be collected in the first year. Expenditure of revenue from the millage will be subject to oversight by the Oakland County Board of Commissioners and to independent audits.

CITY OF AUBURN HILLS

City Adult Use Marijuana Establishments Proposal Shall the City of Auburn Hills adopt an ordinance to repeal the City of Auburn Hills Prohibition of Marijuana Establishments and Medical Marijuana Facilities Ordinance and adopt an ordinance to require the City to approve at least 4 adult use marijuana establishments to operate in the City?

CITY OF BIRMINGHAM Proposed Amendment to Chapter VI, City of Birmingham Charter

Proposed amendments to Chapter VI. – Contracts, Section 1, Section 2 and Section 3 of the City of Birmingham Charter. The proposed amendments substitute in these sections the amount of Seventyfive Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) for the current amounts of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) in Section 1.-[Specifications for bids.], Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00) in Section 2.-[Bids required.], and One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) in Section 3.[Commission approval required.]. While the first Section relates to all City contracts, the latter two (2) Sections relate solely to contracts for public improvements.

CITY OF CLARKSTON

Medical Marihuana Proposal

Medical Marihuana Proposal Explanatory Caption This amendment would authorize two (2) provisioning centers within the City and create regulations for the facilities by adding a new Chapter 16 to the City Charter.

Further, this provision would authorize marihuana facilities to operate between the hours of 9 AM to 9 PM Monday through Sunday. It would not permit recreational marihuana sales to any adult but does allow Commercial Medical Marihuana sales under the Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing Act to qualified patients.

This proposed charter amendment, if adopted, would end the City's prohibition of medical marihuana facilities and establish a local licensing system and regulatory provisions for medical marihuana facilities to operate within the City.

CITY OF KEEGO HARBOR

Keego Harbor Charter Amendment Adding Section 11.5(b) Dedicated Police Millage

It is proposed that the supplemental police millage in Section 11.5(a) expiring in 2026 of 4.0 mills (\$4.00 per \$1,000.00 taxable value) on taxable property within the city of Keego Harbor, reduced to 3.6189 mills (\$3.619 dollars per \$1,000.00 taxable value) by required millage rollbacks, be replaced and increased to 8.00 mills levied for 7 years 2023 to 2029, inclusive by adding Section 11.5(b). When levied in 2023, this millage would raise an estimated \$853,128,00 in the first year. Approximately \$111,592.00 will be required to be distributed to the Tax Increment Finance Authority.

Charter Amendment

This proposed charter amendment, if adopted, would assist patients in need of medical marihuana for conditions such as epilepsy, multiple sclerosis, colitis, arthritis, crohn's disease, cerebral palsy, chronic pain, parkinson's disease, post traumatic stress disorder and other medical conditions for which marihuana is an approved medical use by the State of Michigan, end the City's prohibition of medical marihuana facilities, and create a City Department of Medical Marihuana responsible for overseeing the local regulatory structure for such facilities. Shall the proposal be adopted?

CITY OF LATHRUP VILLAGE Cannabis Establishments

Charter Amendment Proposal 1 Shall the City of Lathrup Village Charter be amended to prohibit all Cannabis Establishments within the boundaries of the City.

CITY OF PONTIAC

Restoration of Pontiac Operating Millage Rate

To support the general operations and fire services of the City of Pontiac, shall the City of Pontiac be authorized to impose an increase of 1.0868 (1.09 per 1,000 of taxable value), for a period of ten (10) years (2023-2032) inclusive, as new additional millage in excess of the limitation imposed by MCL 211.34d to restore additional millage previously authorized by Charter as reduced by operation of the Headlee amendment? Such millage, if fully levied, would raise an estimated \$1,218,038 in the first year.

[All amounts levied under this millage on property located outside of certain Tax Increment Financing, Brownfield and Land Bank Authority jurisdictions will be disbursed directly to the City of Pontiac. Michigan law requires that certain amounts levied under this millage on property located within the referenced Tax Increment Financing, Brownfield and land Bank Authority jurisdictions be disbursed to these authorities. Total disbursement to these authorities is estimated to account for less than 15% of total millage revenue.]

CITY OF ROYAL OAK

Senior Services Millage Proposal

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be imposed on taxable property in the City of Royal Oak, Michigan be increased by 0.2000 mill (\$0.20 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of five (5) years, 2022 to 2026, inclusive for the sole purpose of providing fundings for services, activities, and programs for "older persons" pursuant to the authority provided by Act 39 of PA 1976, specifically MCL 400.576? It is estimated that, if levied, the 0.2000 mill would raise approximately \$622,000 when first levied in December 2022.

CHARTER PROPOSAL

Parks, Forestry, Recreation, Playgrounds and Animal Shelter Millage

City of Royal Oak Charter Amendment authorizing the levy of a five-year tax millage of up to 0.700 mills for parks, forestry, recreation and playgrounds including animal shelter purposes, commencing December 2022

It is proposed that Section 11(e) be added to the City Charter of the City of Royal Oak authorizing the levy of up to 0.700 mills (\$0.70 per \$1000 of taxable value) for a period of five (5) years, 2022 to 2026, inclusive, to be used for parks, forestry, recreation and playgrounds, including animal shelter purposes which will raise an estimated \$2,175,794 when first levied in 2022

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP Safety Path Millage Renewal

Shall the Charter Township of Bloomfield renew and continue to levy the voter authorized safety path tax levy of .4511 mills, (reduced by required millage rollbacks), due to expire in 2024, authorizing a levy of \$.4511 per \$1,000 of taxable value to support, fund and finance the Charter Township of Bloomfield's continuing safety path program, including for the construction and maintenance of safety paths and the acquisition of rights-of-way for said safety paths, for a period of 5 years, with the renewed millage to be levied commencing in December 2024. This renewed safety path millage will be subject to applicable statutory and constitutional tax limitation provisions at the time of the levy and will not exceed the above stated rate. It is estimated that this proposal would result in the authorization to collect \$2,287,000 in the first year if approved and fully levied.

Senior Services Millage Renewal and Increase

Shall the Charter Township of Bloomfield renew the voter authorized senior services millage of .2273 mills (reduced by required millage rollbacks) due to expire in 2024 and increase said millage by a new .1027 mills for a total millage rate of .3300, authorizing a levy of \$.3300 per \$1,000 of taxable value to finance the Charter Township of Bloomfield's continued staffing, equipping and operating of the Township's Senior Center and providing of senior services in the Township, including, but not limited to, adult day care service, transportation service, nutrition service, management service and marketing and outreach services, including consultation projects, for a period of 10 years, with the total renewed and new millage to be levied commencing in December 2024. This total renewed and new millage will be subject to applicable statutory and constitutional tax limitation provisions at the time of the levy and will not exceed the above stated rate. It is estimated that this proposal would result in the authorization to collect \$1,673,000 in the first year if approved and fully levied.

BRANDON TOWNSHIP Proposal to Allow Limited Marijuana Facilities in Brandon Township

A proposal to amend the Code of Ordinances to add Chapter 25, Marijuana Establishments to authorize one marijuana retailer in Brandon Township and maintain the prohibition on all other marijuana establishments pursuant to the authority granted by initiated Law 1 of 2018 the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marijuana Act, and to repeal inconsistent ordinances.

Shall the Township of Holly add two additional trustees to the township board, for a total of four trustees, with the two additional trustees to be elected at the November 2024, General Election?

INDEPENDENCE TOWNSHIP **Charter Township of Independence Police Protection Millage**

Shall the Charter Township of Independence be authorized to levy a tax limitation increase up to 2.8678 mills, reduced by the required millage rollbacks, for a period of three (3) years, starting with the December 2023 levy, for the purpose of continuing to provide police protection and law enforcement services within the Township?

In 2018, Independence Township voters approved a millage for police protection in the amount of 2.8678 mills. Approval of the above proposal would allow the Township to increase the current tax levy back to the 2018 levy amount of up to 2.8678 mills (\$2.8678 per \$1,000 of taxable value), which may be reduced by the required millage rollbacks beginning with the first levy in December 2023. The proposal will continue police protection services within the Township, which may include the purchase of equipment, operating costs, officer quarters, and personnel costs related to police and school liaison law enforcement protection. It is estimated this proposal would result in the authorization to collect up to \$5,831,436.00 in the first year, if approved and levied. It is estimated that 98.27% of the annual millage revenue would be disbursed to the Charter Township of Independence for police services and 1.73% would be disbursed to the Township's Sashabaw Road Corridor Improvement Authority. The amount disbursed to the Sashabaw Road Corridor Improvement Authority is required by law and is collected solely from properties located in the Sashabaw Road Corridor Improvement Author-

LYON TOWNSHIPFire Department Dedicated Millage Proposal

In 2023, shall the Charter Township of Lyon, Oakland County, Michigan, increase the 2014 voter-approved levy of 1.580 mills (which has been re-duced to 1.4985 pursuant to MCL 211.34(d)), which is due to expire in 2024, by .90 mills, resulting in a millage of 2.3985 (\$2.40 on each \$1,000 of taxable value) for the remaining two years of the millage, 2023-2024, inclusive, and subject to authorized disbursements mandated by law, for the purposes of Fire Department property, apparatus, equipment, required personnel, and the general operation of fire services, estimated to provide revenue of \$3,762,272 in the first year of collection, of which a portion will be disbursed to the Charter Township of Lyon Downtown Development Authority as required by law?

Library Bond Proposition

Shall the Charter Township of Lyon, Oakland
County, Michigan, borrow a sum of money not to exceed Thirteen Million Dollars (\$13,000,000) and issue its unlimited tax general obligation bonds therefor for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, furnishing, and equipping a new, approximately 19,000 sq. ft. public library facility on Township property and improving library facility on Township property and improving the site thereof? The maximum number of years the bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of refunding, is 30 years; the estimated millage that will be levied to pay the proposed bonds in the first year that the levy is authorized is 0.4677 mills (\$0.4677 per \$1,000 of taxable value of real and tangible personal property in the Charter Township of Lyon); and the estimated simple average annual millage that will be required to retire the bonds is 0.3931 mills.

OAKLAND TOWNSHIP Police Millage Renewal

Shall the Charter Township of Oakland be authorized to continue the previously authorized levy after applying the Headlee rollback up to an estimated 1.6253 mills for a period of six (6) years, starting with the December 2023 levy to be disbursed to Oakland Township for the purpose of providing police services; including equipment, operating costs, officer quarters and personnel costs in the Township?

The voters approved a millage for the above-stated purposes in the amount of 1.7193 mills starting with the December 2017 levy, which will expire in December of 2022. This proposed millage is a renewal of previously authorized millage for the above stated purpose. Approval of this proposal would renew the tax limitation increase of approximately 1.6253 per \$1,000 of taxable value on all taxable property in the Township. It is estimated that based on the Township's current 2022 total taxable value, this proposal would result in the authorization to collect \$2,861,600.00 in the first year, if approved and levied.

ORION TOWNSHIP
Parks and Recreation Millage Renewal
Shall the Charter Township of Orion be authorized to levy up to .9537 mills, as reduced by millage rollbacks required by law, for a period of five (5) years beginning in 2023 through 2027, inclusive, for operating and maintaining the Township's Parks and Recreation services and facilities? The proceeds of the levy will be used for operation, programming the levy will be used for operation, programming, equipment, facilities, personnel, maintenance, acquisition, capital improvements and all related costs of the Orion Township Parks and Recreation Department. Approval of this proposal would approve a tax levy of up to .9537 mills (\$.9537 per \$1,000 of taxable value) on all taxable property in the Township. It is estimated that this proposal would result in the authorization to collect up to \$2,020,953.49 in the first year, if approved and levied.

ROYAL OAK TOWNSHIP Ballot Proposal

The proposal, if adopted, would enact an ordinance to assist patients in need of medical marihuana for conditions such as epilepsy, multiple sclerosis, colitis, arthritis, crohn's disease, cerebral palsy, chronic pain, parkinson's disease, post traumatic stress disorder and other critical medical conditions, and repeal the Township's prohibition of marihuana establishments. Shall the proposal be adopted?

This proposition would:

1) Allow State licensed Marihuana Establishments to operate within the Village in any zoning district including residential zoning;

2) Provide for an Ordinance for regulation of Recreational Marihuana for the operation of an establishment within the Village limits for growers, processors, retailers, transporters and microbusinesses.

CLARKSTON COMMUNITY SCHOOLS Bonding Proposal

Shall Clarkston Community Schools, Oakland County, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed One Hundred Ninety-Seven Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$197,500,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, in one or more series, for the purpose of:

erecting, furnishing, and equipping additions to, and an outdoor learning space and a storage structure at, the Junior High School; remodeling, furnishing and refurnishing, and equipping and re-equipping school buildings and other facilities; acquiring, installing, and equipping and re-equipping school buildings for, instructional technology; and preparing, developing, improving, and equipping playgrounds, athletic fields and facilities, parking areas, drives, sidewalks, and sites?

The following is for informational purposes only: The estimated millage that will be levied for the proposed bonds in 2023, under current law, is 1.58 mills (\$1.58 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a -0- mills net increase over the prior year's levy. The maximum number of years the bonds of any series may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is twenty-five (25) years. The estimated simple average annual millage anticipated to be required to retire this bond debt is 3.27 mills (\$3.27 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation).

The school district expects to borrow from the State School Bond Qualification and Loan Program to pay debt service on these bonds. The estimated total principal amount of that borrowing is \$26,620,735 and the estimated total interest to be paid thereon is \$10,512,610. The estimated duration of the millage levy associated with that borrowing is twelve (12) years and the estimated computed millage rate for such levy is 7.0 mills. The estimated computed millage rate may change based on changes in certain circumstances.

The total amount of qualified bonds currently outstanding is \$146,305,000. The total amount of qualified loans currently outstanding is approximately \$4,966,052.

FARMINGTON PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT Operating Millage Restoration Proposal
