How 26 People In The Census Count Helped Minnesota Beat New York For A House Seat

Thanks to LWV ABC member Kathie Whelchel for sharing her email conversation with Matt Brown, Economic Development Director for the City of Coon Rapids. Their email pointed out the importance of the work of LWV and many others in promoting the 2020 Census and providing accurate, objective information to help people make informed decisions about responding to the Census. (Do you remember back in October of 2019, when we actually met in person and Matt Brown talked about what the Census would mean to Coon Rapids? Here's the video.) I agree that the League and the City can take credit for at least some of the success. Coon Rapids' self-response rate relative to the State's increased notably between 2010 and 2020. We all knew it could be close, but I never expected it'd be this close!

How 26 People In The Census Count Helped Minnesota Beat New York For A House Seat Small census numbers can make a big difference. If Minnesota's 2020 count included 26 fewer residents, it might have lost a seat in Congress — a seat that New York fell short of winning by 89 people.

We've heard that Minnesota saved our Eighth Congressional seat over New York by 89 votes. But actually, given the formulas that are used to apportion Congressional seats, the difference was 26 ... here's a quote from Susan Brower, Minnesota State Demographer:

"We found that had Minnesota counted 26 fewer residents that we would have lost that eighth congressional district," Brower says. "I knew it was going to be very tight, but I just didn't think it could possibly come out to be that close."

We all deserve a hand for the work that was done. Good work!
